SUE SUGAR TRUST FOR MONEY DUE FOR STAMPS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—Sult was ordered by Postmaster General Burleson today to recover from the United States Beet Sugar Industry \$57,609, which it is alleged should have been paid in postage on a pamphlet circulated under Senator Lodge's frank while the Underwood tariff bill was before congress. Information concerning this pamphlet, which the postal authorities claim was illegally franked, was brought out during the recent senate lobby investigation. The pamphlet was the work of Truman H. Palmer, secretary of the United States Beet Sugar Industry. A statement issued by the department today said: Senator Lodge obtained, on July 27 1912, an order of the senate to print certain charts displayed in the senate to illustrate his speech which were furnished by Mr. Palmer. A proof of the charts was furnished to Mr. Palmer, who enlarged it beyond the scope of the senate order and it was printed under an alleged order of a different date of which the senate has no record.
