It had been hoped here that Austria-ilungary, having but small interests in the Far East, would not force a breach of relations with Japan, especially as Austria-Hungary always has been regarded as friendly to Japan. Baron Von Mueller, the Aus trian ambassador and the members of his staff, always have been popular here.

The censoring of news from China is most effective. It is believed here, however, that Japan has not yet landed troops at Kiao-Chow, the German lessed territory in China against which she has begun military operations. There is reason to believe that the Japanese navy is carefully sweeping the waters around Klao-Chow for mines, which, it is known. have been submerged recently in large numbers.

LOSS IN STEAMER COLLISION ELEVEN

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 27 .- The SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 27.—The four "missing" passengers of the steamship Admiral Sampson, sunk 20 miles north of Seattle yesterday by collision with the Princess Victoria yesterday are said by the Pacific Alaska Navigation company, owners of the lost boat to be quite unknown to them and the list of 11 dead authorized by the company yesterday is declared to be complete. The Sampson is lying in 400 feet of water, and probably contains ten bedies which will be allowed to remain entombed in the hulk, for divers and wreckers cannot work at such a depth. Ezra Byrne, stowaway, the 11th victim died in a hospital here. A tug is cruising about the place of the wreck, seeking bodies, but without expectation of finding any. Search in the floating wreckage yesterday was unavailing.
