200 WARSHIPS
OFF HELGOLAND
AWAIT GERMANS

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—Two hundred British warships lie in battle line off the German naval base of Helgoland, so close that at times they appear to touch each other, according to Captain Skelley of the British oil tank steamer San Lorenzo, which reached New York today from London.

REFUGEES FLEEING
RHEIMS IN RUINS

LONDON, Sept. 22, 3:22 a. m.—The Daily Mail's correspondent at Rheims, under date of Sunday sends this description of the scene there: "Following five days of bombardment constantly increasing in intensity, there is streaming along the wet, muddy roads to Eprenay, a sad procession of refugees of all classes from Rheims. They are in every sort of vehicle except the motor car, and have been driven by the destruction of the city to seek shelter elsewhere."

AMERICAN RELIEF
COMMITTEE FINISHES

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—The American relief committee, which has been helping stranded Americans in Christiania, Norway, has about finished its work and will sail for London Friday. Further relief work will be conducted by American diplomatic and consular officers.

POPE PROTESTS AGAINST
LOSS OF CATHEDRAL

LONDON, Sept. 22, 8:25 a. m.—A Rome dispatch to the Central News says that the pope has telegraphed to the German emperor protesting against the destruction of the cathedral of Rheims.

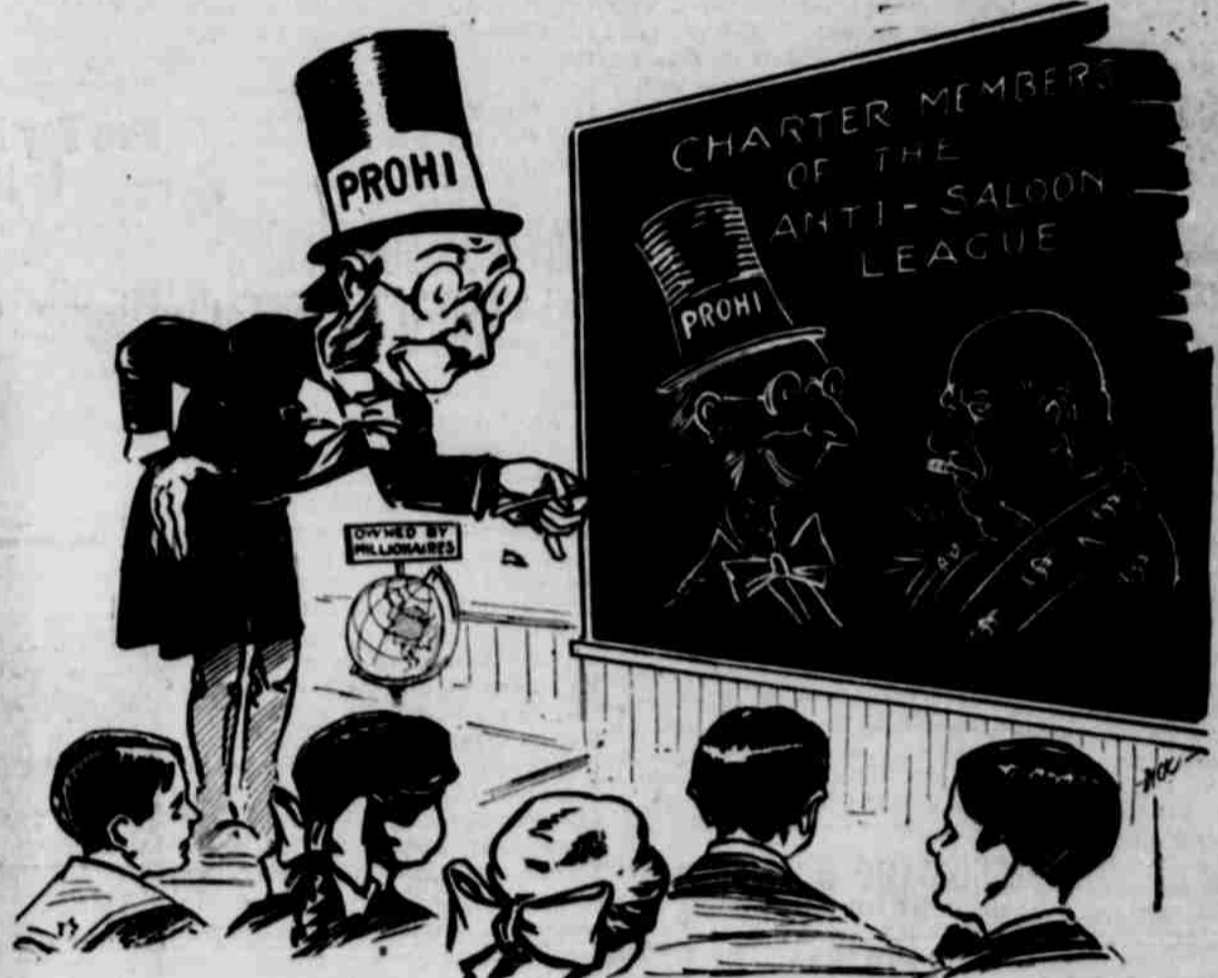
