

One of the many prominent features in favor of the Ogden route is that the lay-over at Roseville approximates three hours, as compared with about 18 hours' lay-over at Portland.

The running time of 7 days, 15 hours to Chicago, and 10 days, 6 hours to New York, or approximately 8 and 11 days days through service respectively was consistently made and in several cases beaten.




