

# MRS. CARMAN TO TAKE STAND IN OWN BEHALF

In Opening Statement for Defense Attorney Claims Will Prove Crime Was Committed by an Unknown Man—Testimony of Maid Attacked—Defendant to Take Stand.

MINEOLA, N. Y., Oct. 22.—Mrs. Florence Conklin Carman, on trial as the slayer of Mrs. Louise Bailey, entered the courtroom in the Nassau county court house here on this, the fourth day of her trial, expecting to take the stand this afternoon as her own chief witness.

Frank Farrell, who testified yesterday afternoon that he had seen a woman running from the window through which the shot was fired, around to Carman house to the rear, was recalled to the stand for a continuation of his cross examination when court convened.

As on preceding days the courtroom was crowded with women. Elizabeth Carman, the 12-year-old

daughter of the defendant, was permitted to sit with her mother at the counsel table.

**Unknown Is Blamed**  
John Graham, Mrs. Carman's lawyer, questioned Farrell closely about his movements on the day of the murder. The story related by the witness was practically the same as that given on direct examination. George M. Levy of Mrs. Carman's counsel then began his opening address.

"We will prove," said Mr. Levy, "that this crime was not committed by Mrs. Carman, but by a man whose motive we do not know."

Mr. Levy told of Mrs. Carman's actions on the day and night of the murder. He said she went to New York during the day, contracted a headache and after dinner went to bed.

"Mrs. Carman will tell you that she then heard a shot and some commotion downstairs," he said. This was the first definite declaration from the defense that she was to testify.

"She immediately put on a kimono and leaned over the banister. She did not go into the office, because Dr. Carman had forbidden her to do so.

"She will admit all about the telephonic instrument and will tell you that she had it installed to find out if the things she had heard about the doctor's relations with women were true. We will show you that there can be no suspicion attached to Mrs. Carman's talks with me because I was a friend of the family and had been for years.

"As to the witness Farrell, we will prove him a liar."

**Assail Maid's Testimony**  
A vigorous assault on the testimony given yesterday by Celia Coleman, the Carman maid, was begun by the defense' first witness, Benedict Cheesman, a negro stenographer of New York.

Cheesman testified that he and two negro lawyers called on Celia in New York on July 14 last, and that the lawyers questioned Celia while he took down question and answers in shorthand. He identified a typewritten statement as the one she had made. In it, Celia said she wanted to tell the whole truth. She was not under oath, however, and made no mention of Mrs. Carman's having shown her a revolver.

Cheesman continued his testimony at the afternoon session.

Several persons from Charleston, S. C., brought here by the district attorney, were prepared to testify for the state as to Celia Coleman's reputation for truthfulness.

William Austin, a barber, of New York City, testified that he saw Farrell with Crogan at 7:15 o'clock the night of the murder. He denied that he was known in New York City as a gunman.

# VIOLENT ATTACKS OF GERMANS FAIL TO MOVE ALLIES

PARIS, Oct. 22, 2:45 p. m.—The official announcement issued this afternoon by the French war office says the positions occupied by the allies in Belgium and northern France have been maintained in spite of the violent attacks of the enemy.

The text of the announcement follows:

"On our left wing, German forces in considerable strength have continued their violent attacks, particularly in the vicinity of Plixmude, Warnton, Armentieres, Radlignhem and La Bassee, but the positions occupied by the allies have been maintained.

"On the rest of the front the enemy has delivered only partial attacks. These all have been repulsed, particularly at Fricourt, to the east of Albert; on the plateau to the west of Craonne; in the region of Souain, in the Argonne district; at Four de Paris; southwest of Varennes; in the region of Malancourt, in the Woevre district; in the direction of Champillon, and at a point southeast of St. Mihiel, in the forest of Alilly.

"We have made slight progress in

(the Argonne district and in the southern part of the Woevre, in the forest of Mortmare.

"Russia: The forward movement of the Russian forces has been positively announced. An important success in the region of Warsaw has driven back the enemy more than 13 kilometers (eight miles.) The advances of the Russians at Ivangorod and to the south of Przemysl are equally perceptible."

# RUSSIAN LOAN FOR ENGLISH MARKET

PARIS, Oct. 22, 9:35 a. m.—A Havas Agency dispatch from Petrograd says the Russian minister of finance has been authorized by imperial decree to place short term treasury bonds amounting to sixty million on the English market.
