I. W. W. WOMAN TRIED AT TARRYTOWN

Y., Oct. 29.—Becky Edelson, militant young woman leader of the Industrial Workers of the World, went to trial today on a charge of disorderly conduct in connection with meetings held here last spring by anarchist leaders, in which she took a part. The case against her was the only one of more than twelve indictments. Most of the other charges resulted in convictions and in short prison terms.
