

DRAMA LEAGUE HIGHLY ENDORSES PLAY OF MILESTONES

The Medford Center of the Drama League of America, Bulletin No. 1. Play: "Milestones," a comedy in three acts that ran for three years in London and a year in New York.

Comment: This play has been influenced by most of the eastern centers. Washington says (Bulletin No. 4, December 21, 1912): "A play of unusual charm, original in idea, picturesquely set. More than that, an important play, voicing the modern spirit of protest against blind allegiance to precedent, a plea for individuality and independent thinking, for open-mindedness, for adjustment of social standards to the more intelligent morality and democracy of modern thought."

"The story which carries this theme is told in novel dramatic form, showing significant moments in the lives of three generations of the same family. Youthful independence and radicalism, combating the conservatism of age, triumph in the brother, but the sister is sacrificed; the same brother, grown old, sacrifices his daughter, and that daughter would sacrifice her daughter to the same unreasoned tradition and family pride. These milestones of sacrifice, however, which have marked an intellectual progress perfecting self-assertion in modern youth, convey at the same time a warning."

"Notwithstanding the three-act plan of the story, and the changing characters from act to act, the interest is cumulative and compelling, a note worthy conquest of a problem on the part of the authors, in spite of an unfortunate concession to the happy ending idea. The early act scenes provide a quaintness of atmosphere, and the characters, convincingly drawn, are well interpreted by a capable company of (English) actors."

"Milestones" should be seen by all lovers of the theater. It is one of the plays which sustain belief in the vitality and high artistic merit of the modern drama at its best."

BELGIANS OPENED SLUICES OF YSER DROWNING ENEMY

LONDON, Oct. 30, 5:10 p. m.—A dispatch from the correspondent of the Reuter Telegram Company at Paris says:

"The news today is excellent. I am able to state on the best authority that the efforts of the allies are being crowned with success."

"In consequence of the opening of the sluices of the Yser canal, thousands of Germans were caught. Those who escaped drowning were harassed by the artillery."

"Some points of extra strategic importance have been occupied by the left wing of the allies, while along practically the whole rest of the front as far as the French eastern frontier the allies' progress continues."

CAMPAIGN EXPENSES SENATORIAL RACE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—Prediction reports of campaign expenses of senatorial candidate in Pacific coast states were filed today.

In Oregon Senator Chamberlain reported expenses of \$92,411, to which William F. McComb of New York, chairman of the democratic national committee, contributed \$250, and Senator Marline of New Jersey \$100.

R. A. Booth, republican candidate, reported expenditures of \$28,225 and contributions of \$1,590, made up principally of \$250 contributions from four Oregon citizens.

W. W. Black, democratic candidate in Washington, reported expenses of \$114,220 and no contributions.

Ole Hanson, progressive, reported expenses of \$2145 and no contributions.

TURKS BOMBARD ODESSA SINKING MERCHANT SHIPS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—Acting Secretary Lansing today announced receipt of a telegram from the American charge d'affaires at Petrograd, saying Odessa has been bombarded and some American property destroyed.

The dispatch from Charge Wilson transmitted a message from the American consul at Odessa, who said he would send a fuller report later on the extent of American property damaged. He did not say by whom the bombardment was done, but it is presumed here that it was Turkish ships.

LONDON, Oct. 30, 7:39 a. m.—A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Petrograd declares that Odessa was also visited by Turkish warships. It says: "Two Turkish destroyers fired shells at Odessa harbor, sinking a merchant ship. The Turks also bombarded Novorossiysk."

"Two Turkish officers landed at Theodosia, on the southeast coast of Crimea, to demand the surrender of the port. The governor promptly imprisoned them."

"There is keen interest here as to the attitude of the Balkan States, that she was bound by no treaty compelling joint action. It is believed that she would join the allies against the Turks if assured of some reward at the end of the conflict. Humanitarian feeling is more than ever favorable to the allies."

"Public opinion here, while surprised at Turkey's action, welcomes the opportunity presented to settle the eastern question once for all."

TURKEY DECLARES WAR ON RUSSIA, BOMBARDS SEAPORT

LONDON, Oct. 30, 3:45 a. m.—A Petrograd dispatch to Reuter's Telegram company says:

"A dispatch from Kertch, a seaport in the Crimea, reports that near Takol lighthouse, the Russian steam-

er Yalta, from the Caucasus, was sunk by a torpedo launched by the Turkish cruiser Goeben. The crew and passengers were saved.
