

### FOREST RESERVES BENEFITS TO STATE WHEREIN LOCATED

Forest Supervisor Erickson announces that during the fiscal year 1914, over 12,000,000 feet (board measure) of timber in Oregon and 2,000,000 feet (board measure) in Washington were given away under free use permit. This free distribution is limited to \$20 worth per year per settler, or about eighty cords.

The excess in Oregon over Washington is accounted for in several ways. The national forests in Oregon cover approximately 13,500,000 acres, while those in Washington cover only about 9,500,000 acres. In Washington the forests are mainly in the Douglas fir region west of the Cascades, and are not as accessible as the east side forests; while those in Oregon are scattered over the state. In eastern Oregon, in the dry region, there is little or no timber except in the national forests, and the farmers and settlers depend upon them for their wood supply. Over 74 per cent of the free wood taken out was dead or down timber, whose removal is a great benefit to the forest, as it lessens the danger from fire.

#### Sales From Forests

In addition to timber given away, 521 sales were made from Oregon forests and 142 from Washington. It is interesting to note that this represents 24,594,000 board feet for Oregon forests and 199,146,000 board feet for Washington forests.

Although the number of sales in Oregon exceeds the number in Washington, the amount of timber is greater in Washington because the sales were larger—one was for 58,000,000 feet and another for 50,000,000 feet; whereas the 521 sales in Oregon represent smaller individual sales, 93 per cent of them being small sales involving \$100 worth or less. In eastern Oregon on one forest alone 164 sales were made. The average price received for the timber was \$1.78 per 1000. The revenue from sales amounted to \$159,362 for Oregon and \$90,647 for Washington; 35 per cent of this amount is turned over to the state for road and school purposes.

#### Grazing Business Heavy

The grazing business, too, is heavy on the national forests of the two states. Last year the grazing privilege was granted in Oregon for 169,451 cattle and horses and 872,862 sheep, and in Washington for 14,571 cattle and horses and 193,598 sheep. This represents 2204 permits for Oregon and 510 for Washington. Again the difference in the business for the two states is due to the difference in the character of the forests. The forests of eastern Oregon are much more open than the forests on the west side of the Cascades, and furnish better opportunity for feeding stock. Furthermore, the Oregon forests are easily accessible, and usually fully stocked, because the available winter range is much more extensive.

In order to administer and protect these national forests, the forest service has, up to date, constructed in Oregon 427 miles of road, 2263 miles of trail, 2428 miles of telephone line and 79 bridges, and in Washington 704 miles of road, 1329 miles of trail, 974 miles of telephone line and 52 bridges. Not only does this improvement work aid in the administration of the forests, but it opens them up for the use of the public.

There is another benefit which the states receive as a result of national forest activities, and that is in the money which this branch of the government spends annually in the locality for labor and supplies. This amounts to an average of \$58,414 for Oregon and \$270,465 for Washington.

### NO CHANGE IN WEST FLANDERS

BERLIN, Nov. 19, via Marconi wireless to London, 3 p. m.—A German official communication given out in Berlin today says:

"The situation in West Flanders and in the north of France is unchanged."

"A German aviation squadron encountered some of the enemy's aviators while making a reconnoitering flight and caused them to descend, one of them falling. One of our flying machines is missing."

"A fierce French attack in the region of Servon on the western slopes of the Arzonne forest, was repulsed with heavy loss to the enemy. Our losses were small."

"In the eastern theater of the war the newly commenced battles are proceeding."

### BERLIN WITHOUT NEWSPAPERS A DAY

BERLIN, Nov. 19, via The Hague and London, 6:11 a. m.—For the first time since the outbreak of the war the Germans spent the day without their newspapers, the publication of which was suspended because of the religious day of repentance. The daily report from war headquarters appeared as usual, but there was no means of circulating it, except through bulletins posted in shop windows and by means of a telegraphic extract displayed in the postoffice downtown.

The streets of Berlin today were crowded with the customary throng, the crisp autumn afternoon having brought out a host of promenaders. The crowds were scarcely different from those seen in ordinary years and there seems to be almost as many men as usual. The spirit of the promenaders was confident as a result of the Russian defeats reported yesterday.

The Neue Freie Presse correspondent says at the capture of Valievo, Servia, the Servians had no time to destroy their guns or supplies, great quantities of which fell into the hands of the Austrians. More than 6000 Servians were taken prisoners.

### FEDERATION AID FOR CALUMET MINES

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 19.—The annual convention of the American Federation of Labor voted to give support to the men arrested in Michigan in connection with the copper strike and to aid the textile strikers at Atlanta and the glove maker strikers at Gloversville, N. Y., who have been out 14 weeks.

The dispute between the International Typographical Union and the Bookbinders' Union over control of the mailers employed in the printing business was referred to the executive council for adjustment after much debate.

### WAR SENDS UP PRICE OF ONIONS

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Nov. 19.—One of the unexpected ways in which the war has made itself felt on the Pacific coast is the pronounced activity in the onion market.

Eastern buyers are in the field and within the last few days the price per sack has risen to between 50 and 60 cents, according to quality, which is an average gain of 15 cents a sack. Buyers say the eastern market has been sold out to supply the European demand. Yesterday 10,000 sacks were billed for the east via the Panama canal.

### FIRE DESTROYS BUSINESS SECTION OF FREMONT

FREMONT, Neb., Nov. 19.—Fire in the heart of the business part of Fremont destroyed today four mercantile concerns entailing losses aggregating \$200,000, with insurance of half that amount. Zero weather made the work of the fire department difficult.

### GERMAN CENTER DRIVES RUSSIANS

LONDON, Nov. 19, 12:07 p. m.—The unexpected blow delivered on the Russian center by General Von Hindenburg, with the German army which had retreated from before Warsaw, was the predominating feature of the news reaching London today from the eastern arena of the war.

Having for the time being thrown back the Russian advance toward the German frontier of Posen, General Von Hindenburg is the hero of the hour in Berlin. There is much criticism in Berlin of the German retreat from Warsaw, but if the present marked reversal of form proves permanent, the German center doubtless will retrieve its reputation just as the allies retrieved themselves almost at the gates of Paris. The German wedge from Posen would appear to have driven the Russian center more than 50 miles back from the frontier, so that the line is now about midway between German territory and Warsaw. Elsewhere along the great eastern front the Russians, where they are not progressing, seem to be holding their own.
