

WANT RECIPROCITY WITH FOREIGN LAND FOR FRUIT EXPORTS

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Dec. 5.—"It seems to be an absolute outrage for our government to admit, for instance, all the products of this country free of duty, while the various countries of South America place an exceptionally high duty upon many of our dried and nearly all our canned fruits and vegetables," says H. B. Miller, director of the new University of Oregon school of commerce. Mr. Miller, who is former consul-general from the United States to China, is pushing the industrial survey of Oregon that the state university school of commerce has undertaken, and his investigations have brought him to the above conclusion, among others.
