SISTERS HONOR BIRTH OF ORDER

The sisters and pupils of St. Mary's academy will celebrate tomorrow the seventieth anniversary of the foundation of the sisterhood. Seventy years ago, December 8, three noble women of high ideals, firm faith and courage, united to constitute the first sisterhood of the Holy Names. In a small, unpretentious dwelling on the historic site of one of the old French fortresses on the banks of the St. Lawrence river, they opened the first school of the new community. Today the society numbers 2217 members and counts 119 institutions of learning as fruits of that small beginning.

Mrs. Stribbing had a stroke of paralysis soon after coming to Oregon, which left her entirely helpless, but she was always patient, never complaining. She had always led a Christian and useful life, always trying to help others. Her example of patience is one to be remembered by those she left behind, who will miss her every hour. Both Mr. and Mrs. Friderger administered every care and attention and all was done that could be. Her sweet and peaceful face showed how she was to go to a land where there is no trouble or sorrow. She was ready and willing, and when the end came she passed away like a little child going to sleep. Mrs. Stribbing leaves very few relatives and a host of friends, who will mourn her loss.

PATHETIC CASE BEFORE COURT

M. Polly agreeing to care for the baby and the oldest girl, and to send Mr. Pinion to the asylum.
