(Continued from Page 1.) Universal disarmament, thought Mr. Daniels, was practical. "In my last report," said he, "I expressed the hope that the day would come when this feverish haste and competition in costly engines of destruction would stop and that if this rivalry goes on the burden will become too heavy for any nation to bear. "Wouldn't we be in better position to propose disarmament if we were to stop heavy building programs?" asked Representative Butler. "No," replied the secretary. "It would be unwise for us to act today in any particular as we would not have acted if there had been no war in Europe. After the European war is over, we will learn a great many lessons. It would be a great mistake if we were now to say that because we hope for universal disarmament, we should stop now. We would be in a much better position if we continued construction than if we were to quit now."

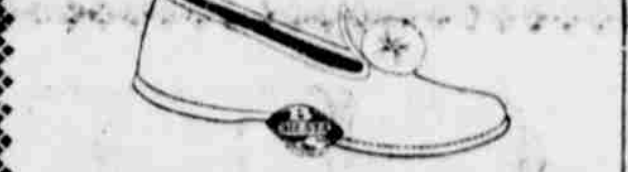
