How to Fight Tuberculosis
In a paper read last year before the Oregon State Medical Society and published in part in the Louisville "Medical Progress," Dr. J. W. Carhart of San Antonio, Texas, a physician who has devoted much time to the study of tuberculosis, said: "Since time immemorial three-fourths of all the mineral substances of the human body, they must be supplied in the foods or supplemented in mineral preparations or natural taxation exercises with tuberculosis unchecked. The widespread and unchecked spread of this disease to the vast other preventable diseases is due largely to the deficient (time lacking) conditions of our modern life throughout the civilized world."
