NAPLES, via Rome, Feb. 8, 10:10 a. m.—It was learned today that the historic monastery of Monte Cassino, near this city, where St. Benedict in 529 A. D. founded the religious order bearing his name, was damaged badly by the recent earthquake.

The government has sent engineers to Monte Cassino to undertake the restoration of the monastery. The modern building materials will be used for the first time for strengthening the ancient structure.

ABSENT SOLONS RETURN TO TIE SHIP BILL VOTE

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8.—With the arrival of Senator Newlands and Senator Smith of South Carolina, the parliamentary situation as regards the administration ship purchase bill was changed today.

As soon as republican leaders learned of the return of Senators Newlands and Smith a conference was called to consider plans of action. The republicans determined to oppose any effort to bring up Senator Gore's resolution to discharge the commerce committee from considering his substitute bill.

Today was one of the few in recent history of the senate when a full attendance, 96 senators, was present.

ALLIES FEAR OF FOOD SHORTAGE BOOSTS WHEAT

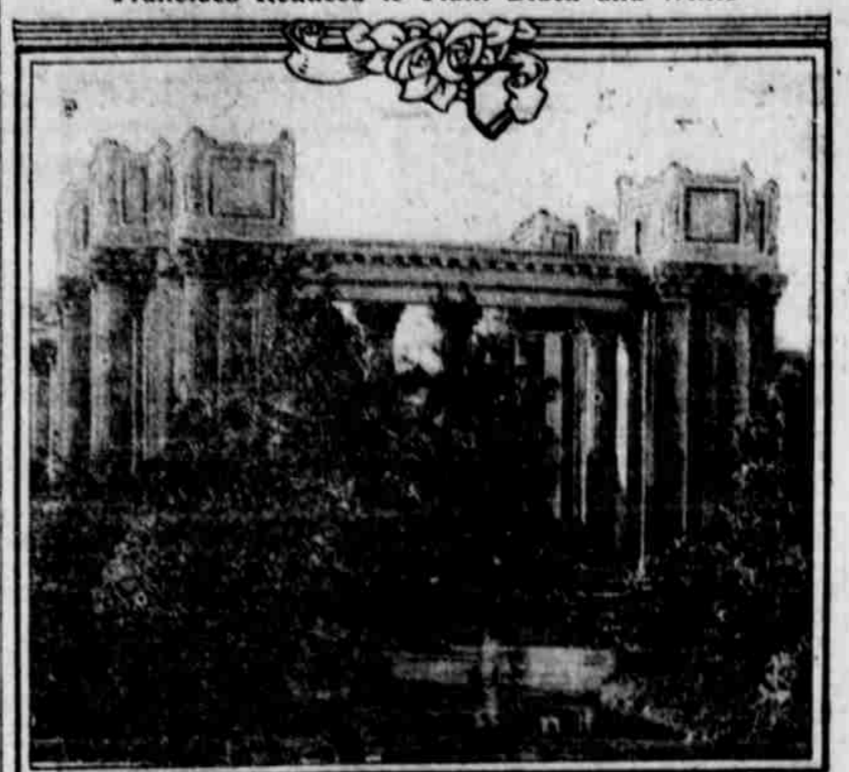
CHICAGO, Feb. 8.—Wheat prices took an upturn toward affected to some extent by Liverpool dispatches telling of fear as to a shortage of supplies in Great Britain and France.

Corn reflected the action of wheat. Commission houses did most of the buying. Pit speculators the bulk of the selling.

Trade in oats was small. Nevertheless, prices hardened in sympathy with other grains. Provisions held comparatively steady.

LONDON, Feb. 8.—The stock market was quiet. American securities were steady and a fraction over parity in the Ironore, but prices were inclined to say in the afternoon.

(February Sunset.) In 1912 the United Wireless company sold in Oregon \$800,000 worth of stock that turned out to be worthless.

In 1913 and 1914 the United States Cashier company attempted to sell stock in Oregon. Before it could insert its fingers into the pockets of unsophisticated owners of legal tender, the state's blue sky commissioners ordered it to move on.

In Michigan and Iowa the Investment Bankers' Association successfully attacked the validity of the blue sky act; in Oregon the Investment Bankers' Association wisely decided to comply with the law.

Indorses Dried Beet Pulp

Christ Naegeli, proprietor of Hazelwood dairy farm, Oregon City, Ore., has recently been converted to the use of dried beet pulp, and in common with many other dairymen and stock feeders, now takes pleasure in recommending it to others.

"After much persuasion I consented to give dried beet pulp a trial for the feeding of dairy cattle. I will admit further that I consented with considerable reluctance, for I did not think the pulp could be profitably bought and fed, holding to the idea that beets could be raised for much less than the price which I paid for beet pulp.

the fact that we of the Willamette valley can raise cow kale to perfection and very cheaply. Last season I did not start to feeding beet pulp until very late, but this year will commence as soon as the grass is gone, and will feed it in connection with mill feed all winter.

Dried beet pulp is proving its worth not only to dairymen but to stock feeders generally. It is greatly relished by hogs, sheep, goats, horses and poultry, as well as cattle, and makes a highly profitable combination with alfalfa or in fact with almost any other feed.
