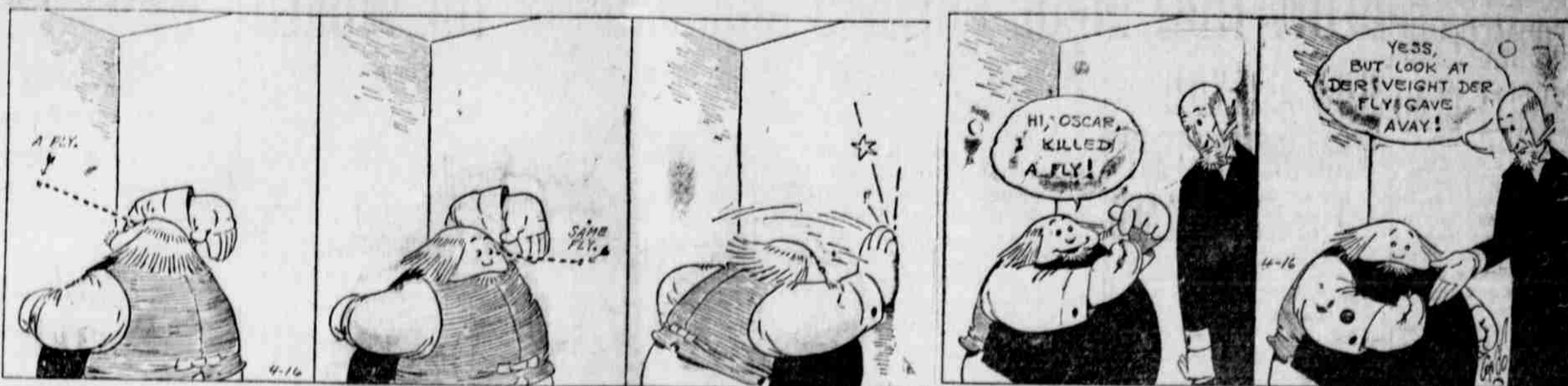
ANNUAL MEETING OF MEDFORD PRESBYTERIANS
