

ROCK ISLAND RECEIVERS NAMED IN FRIENDLY SUIT

CHICAGO, April 20.—The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railway company was placed in the hands of receivers in Judge Carpenter's court here today.

The company admitted its inability to meet more than \$5,000,000 in short-term notes and other obligations due between now and May 1, and the court appointed H. U. Mudge, president of the company, and Jacob M. Dickinson, former secretary of war, receivers.

Application for the receivership was made by the American Steel Foundries company, which has a claim of \$17,000 against the defendant. A. C. Ridgeway, vice-president of the railway company, and W. F. Dickson, its general attorney, appeared in court.

DROP ARSON CHARGE AGAINST SWOBODA

PARIS, April 20.—French military authorities have decided to drop the charge of setting fire to the steamer La Touraine which was preferred against the man known as Raymond Swoboda, says the Petit Parisien.

Swoboda admitted at a preliminary hearing that his real name was Raymond Ruff Schwind, and was removed yesterday from the Santa prison to the Palais de Justice, where he was examined by Captain Bonchardon.

ILLINOIS TOWNS VOTE ON PROHIBITION ISSUE

CHICAGO, April 20.—Twenty-two towns and villages in Illinois voted today on the question of abolishing saloons. Close to 150 saloons are involved in the issue.

Prohibition leaders were confident that women will prove an important factor in the balloting and that at least four counties will be added to the dry column.
