

### RIVER FESTIVAL ON WILLAMETTE OPEN NEW LOCKS

PORTLAND, Ore., May 6.—Today's celebration of the opening of The Dalles-Celilo and the Willamette Falls canals shifted from the Columbia river to the Willamette. Following the formal opening of The Dalles-Celilo canal at Big Eddy yesterday, today's program called for the turning over by the government to public use of the Willamette canal at Oregon City.

The federal government recently purchased the latter from the Portland Railway, Light & Power company for \$375,000. Government ownership of this canal, which is built around the falls at Oregon City, makes possible the free navigation of the Willamette for a distance of 220 miles inland from the sea.

The fleet of river steamers, which started the six-day celebration at Lewiston, Idaho, last Monday, arrived at Vancouver, Wash., and took part in a celebration there early today. The fleet, augmented by other craft, then proceeded up the Willamette to Oregon City, where the principal ceremonies were scheduled to begin at about noon.

This afternoon the fleet was to return to Portland and to join in the celebration here.

### CHILD SLAYER SENDS MOTHER GRIM NOTE

NEW YORK, May 6.—The letter-writing murderer who killed 5-year-old Elenore Cohen and 4-year-old Charlie Murray has written to the Murray boy's mother telling her that he will commit another murder when the present excitement over her child's death subsides. The letter was received today. Mrs. Murray read one paragraph and collapsed. The murder of the boy, who was killed by knife wounds in his abdomen the night of May 3, was preceded by a similar threat contained in a letter addressed to Mrs. Cohen, the mother of the girl, who was killed March 29. Both children the police believe were killed by the same person.

### KAUFF BEGS FEDS FOR NEW CHANCE

NEW YORK, May 6.—In a penitent letter written today to President Gilmore of the Federal Baseball league by Benny Kauff, the Brooklyn club's outfielder who caused a sensation last week when he signed a contract with the New York Nationals, the player asks for reinstatement. He says in part: "I am anxious to play baseball again with the Brookfeds and feel sorry that I followed the advice of older men in the game and took part in the recent trouble." It is generally understood Kauff will be reinstated in time to play next Saturday.

### EARLIEST SAILING ON YUKON; LITTLE ICE

DAWSON, Y. T., May 6.—The first sailing on the Yukon river this year occurred yesterday when the steamer Vidette left Lake Lebarge for Dawson. This is the earliest sailing from Lebarge in the history of navigation on the Yukon. Because of low water, it is believed by many that she will be several days making the trip. The river is free of ice everywhere between Dawson and White Horse, the head of navigation, excepting at three points, which probably will be open in a day or two.

### JAPAN DEMANDS LIKE AUSTRIAN NOTE TO SERBIA

LONDON, May 6, 6:57 p. m.—The Daily News today publishes an editorial article on the Chinese situation, which reads in part:

"It would not be easy to parallel such demands from one power to another as Japan has made on China. In many respects they are more stringent than the Austrian demands upon Serbia, which led to the European war, and China has done nothing to incur such a penalty. She offered no menace to Japan and she wanted only to enjoy her own liberties in her own way.

"If China had been a military nation she never would have been thus challenged. She had neither the will nor the power to take an unfriendly and irreconcilable course toward her powerful neighbor, and it is grotesque to suggest that she is responsible for the crisis.

"It will be the last and the most bitter tragedy of this war if one of its consequences be that an offending nation whose independence and integrity the Anglo-Japanese alliance has guaranteed, is to be despoiled by one of the signatories of that alliance."
