NOW IS TIME TO SPRAY FIRST BROOD OF CODDLING MOTH

The first adult coddling moth of which we have any record for this season emerged on the 13th of April. Since that time the moths have been coming out very irregularly, no general emergence as yet having taken place.

To intercept this brood of "worms" the next arsenate of lead spray, at the rate of four pounds to 100 gallons, should be applied between the 15th and 20th of May.

The object in applying this spray is to cover the young fruit and foliage as uniformly as possible with the poisonous or fungicidal material to be protected.
