Billy Lafferty from Grants Pass has been visiting friends in this town for the past few days.

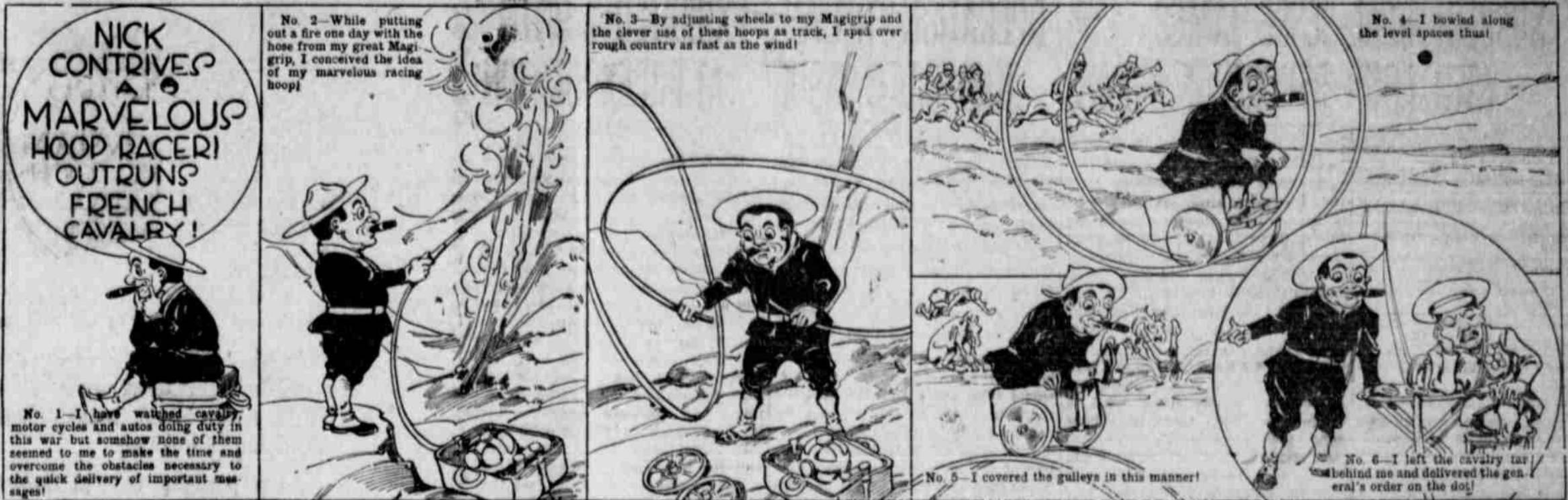
Mrs. Horn from Forest Creek has been staying with Mrs. Thurston.
