GALVESTON, Texas, July 30. General Alvero Obregon, in command of Carranza forces operating against Torreon, reports that he cut off and defeated a large force of Villa troops south of that city. This information was contained in a cablegram from Vera Cruz reaching the Constitutional consulate here today,

The message adds that after defeating this force, Obregon resumed the march upon Torreon and that two other Carranza columns under Generals Trevino and Arrieta are moving upon this city in co-operation with Obregon.

It also is reported that General Murgia has occupied the city of Zacatecas without opposition.
