### NEARING THE CHINESE STANDARD.

W HEN James J. Hill remarked that the United States needed half a milion or so of Chinese, because the Office Mail Tribune Building. 25-27-29 Chinamen has solved the problem of living on 10 or 12 cents a day, he undoubtedly aired the view of big business. The promoters of the movement to inculcate thrift among the masses doubtless also consider the Chinese standard the ideal thrift standard.

The Manley report which the Industrial relations commission has ordered submitted to congress, shows how the United States is already on the way to the Chinese standard. The following are taken from it as showing the conditions of labor and industry in America:

Of the millions and millions of workingmen in this ountry, one-third are poverty-stricken.

Five hundred dollars per year is the income of half of the wage-earning fathers.

Less than \$15 per week is the wages of two-thirds of the adult male workers.
