HANG LYNCHERS SAYS MAN WHO PARDONED FRANK

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 17 .- Former Governor Bohn M. Slaton, of Georgia, who was chief executive of taht state commuted to life imprisonment the death sentence passed upon Leo M. Frank, and who is here visiting the Panama-Pacific exposition, was informed today that Frank had been lynched. He expressed himself as deeply shocked and indignant,

"The act was a consummate outrage," said Mr. Slaton, "and every man engaged in the lynching should be hanged, for he is an assassin. Such an act is contrary to the civilization of Georgia and one which every good citizen will condemn.

"I can use no language too condemnatory. I believe the governor of Georgia will use all the power of the state to punish the malefactors who disgraced the civilization of Georgia.

"Thei ract was one of cowardice which belongs alone to the assassin. "I am shocked and horrified beyond expression. Any man who approves of this action of the mob of

murderers is unworthy to be a Geor-"Any man or newspaper which condones this offense ought to be driven out of the state. But the conduct of this miserable mob of assassins is the conduct of the same sort of people who shoot a man from behind

a fence or murder a woman from a cowardly heart. "If I knew any stronger language, I would use it."

The state department has been advised unofficially but authoritatively of the coming action. The exact position of the United States will be undefined until it is officially advised of the new action.
