that their warships had been drawn in close formation to give battle, and an official report received last night from Petrograd said that a German fleet had penetrated the gulf and engaged the Russian vessels.

Germans Take Bielsk. BERLIN, Aug. 21.—The Germans have captured the Russian town of Bielsk, 25 miles south of Bialystok, and have driven the Russians over the Biala river, according to an official announcement given out today by the German army headquarters.

LONDON, Aug. 21.—The Russian armies are fighting desperately but vainly to check the onrush of the Germans and Austrians. Ossowetz, to the north of Poland, has resisted the invaders thus far only because of the marshy nature of the surrounding country, which prevents the Germans from employing their heavy guns effectively.

FOREST FIRES ALL REPORTED UNDER CONTROL

Forest fires all under control, are burning today in the southern Oregon district. The forestry service up to 2 o'clock reported no new fires today. The fire one and three-quarters miles east of Phoenix is still burning over an area covered with brush and fox-tail. This fire is being fought by the Jackson county patrol association.

The fire on the Applegate that threatened 500 acres of timber in the Crater National forest reserve was placed under control last night. A large brush fire is burning on both sides of Fish Lake, but is being kept from the heavy timber. A number of isolated fires, believed to have been started by incendiaries are burning.

BAGGAGE REGULATIONS CHANGED FOR DRUMMERS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—The interstate commerce commission deciding today upheld the contention of traveling salesmen that regulations defining sample baggage as that carried by commercial travelers, "and not for sale or free distribution," are unreasonable. The commission prescribed a new regulation which does not prohibit the occasional sale of free distribution of samples.

All the railroads were ordered to cease enforcing their present restrictions on October 15.

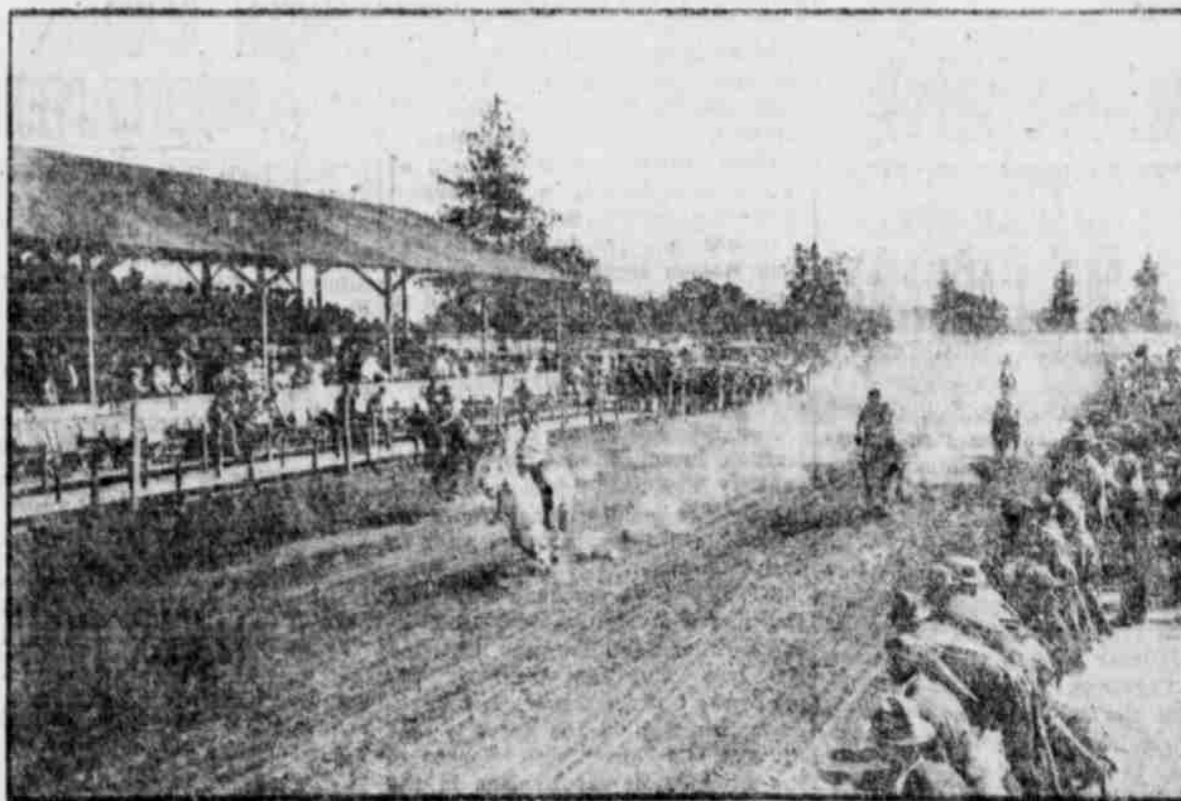
