Ben Fredenburg and family have returned from Crater Lake.

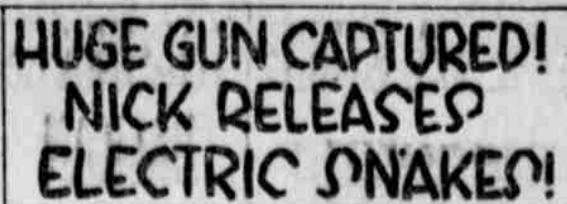
GOLD HILL NUGGETS

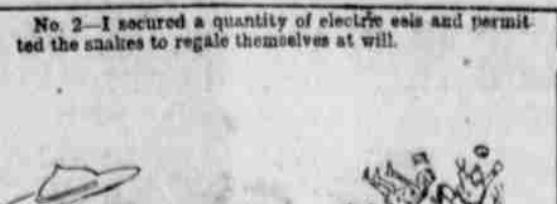

George Hammersley, lately of Weed, Cal., is visiting with his wife at the home of the latter's parents.

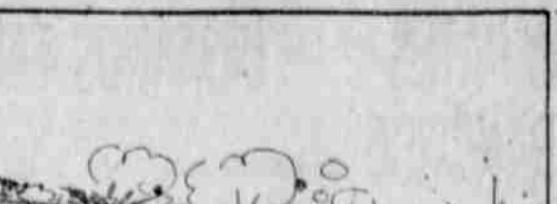
OLD NICODEMUS NIMBLE—AT THE FRONT
