

### COUNTY FAIR OFFICIALLY OPENED THIS AFTERNOON

The eighth annual Jackson county fair will be officially opened this afternoon with the largest display and biggest list of attractions in its history. All day Wednesday the entry clerks were busy listing the displays and a large force was engaged in putting the fruit, farm products, cookery, paintings and other exhibits in shape. The fruit and farm products are especially good, and among the products are sugar beets—the first ever shown at a local fair.

The pupils of the Roosevelt school will give folk games at the fair Friday at 3:30 p. m. in front of the grand stand. This will be well worth the price of admission alone.

The work of judging and awarding the various exhibits will begin today, and the first announcement of the winners made tomorrow. Among the displays in the art department of unusual attractiveness is the painting display of Miss Pauline Hiatt.

**Today's Program**

This afternoon is Medford and Eagle Point day at the fair, and most of the stores of the city will be closed for the occasion. The Medford band will furnish the music. It will also mark the opening of a series of baseball games for a purse of \$300 between the Medford and Roseburg teams. Caster is pitching for Medford this afternoon.

Yesterday afternoon a whirlwind tore the canvas covering from the roof of the horticultural building. A number of teams hitched to the rack became frightened at the appearance of the cloth flapping over their heads and a general mixup with several near runaways occurred. The teams were finally quieted.

Tomorrow and Saturday delegations of citizens from Gold Hill and Ashland will be in attendance, and the most successful fair in the history of the county is predicted.

### FOMENT STRIKES MACHINE TRADES TO HURT ALLIES

CHICAGO, Sept. 9.—Five Chicago firms, said to have contracts for the manufacture of steel casings, or machinery for making them, are the objects of strikes by machinists, according to a story printed in the Evening Post today.

The Post adds that strikes of machinists are being organized against seven other firms said to be affecting war supplies. The stories state that there are no strikes against those known to be in the munitions business.

"The machinists," continues the Post, "state that they are striking for an eight hour day. They deny that they are being financed by any representatives of foreign governments."

William Schoenberger, head of the local machinists, said: "We want better hours and better wages and that is all. The report that we have singled out munitions plants can best be answered by stating that our men are at work in munition plants all over the country."

### WATER ACREAGE IS NOW 22,000 ACRES

The Ashland water committee during the past three days signed up 5500 acres for irrigation, bringing the total to date to approximately 22,000 acres. Land owners of the Ashland and Talent districts are manifesting a strong interest in the new project and there is much talk of the two districts joining and making a solid unit having one irrigation system south of the Ronou River Valley Canal company's ditch at Phoenix. Ashland committees have canvassed the situation and request that they be allowed to become a part of the Talent district. The uniting of the clubs would make a district of 12,000 acres.

The Water Users association will hold a meeting in Medford this morning.

### BOUNDARIES FOR MEDFORD SCHOOLS IN COMING YEAR

For the benefit of patrons and students who are not familiar with the school districts of the city, Supt. Hills has submitted for publication the boundary lines of each district.

**Washington School**

Beginning at the western extremity of Locust street the line extends east on Fourth street to the intersection of Grape street, thence south on Grape street, thence east on Main; thence on Central Avenue south to the limits of the district.

**Jackson School**

Beginning at the western extremity of Locust street, east on Fourth street to the intersection of Grape street; thence east on Main to the S. P. R. R., thence north to the limits of the district.

**Lincoln School**

The Lincoln district comprises all that territory lying between the S. P. R. R. and Bear Creek and north of Main street.

**Roosevelt School**

Beginning at the northern extremity of the district on a line following Bear creek; thence west on Main to the intersection of Central Avenue south; thence south to the limits of the district.

**Enrollment on Monday**

It is urged that all pupils report for enrollment Monday morning in the district in which they live except the eighth grade of the Roosevelt school who will report at the Lincoln school and the eighth grade of the Jackson school who will report at the Washington school. The Washington school will be able to take care of all the grades in its district from the first to the eighth inclusive.

**High School Registration Saturday**

A slight change has been made in the opening routine of the high school. The freshmen, irregular pupils and pupils transferring from their high schools should register Friday before 2 o'clock if possible. The general registration will take place on Saturday from 9 to 12 and from 1 to 2:00. School will open Monday for a short session, all pupils are expected to be on hand promptly at 9 o'clock.

PORTLAND, Sept. 8.—The biggest single deal in apples ever made was announced by the North Pacific Fruit distributors association today through C. A. Malhouer, its representative here. Every box available of "C" grade apples controlled by the association has been sold at a contract price of 85 cents a box, the highest price obtained for this class of fruit in four years. It is estimated that the apples will make four hundred carloads. The amount invested in the deal is \$214,000. A number of middle western firms compose the pool of purchasers.

### DR. W. H. SIMPSON LUMBERMAN, DEAD

RIVERSIDE, Cal., Sept. 9.—Stricken with paralysis, Dr. W. H. Simpson, of the late A. N. Simpson, lumberman of San Francisco, fell down the stairs of a hotel last night and died shortly afterwards from concussion of the brain.

Dr. Simpson came here eighteen months ago. His brothers, L. J. Simpson, of Oregon, and Edgar Simpson, of San Francisco, and a sister, Mrs. Ray Pike of San Francisco, have been notified. The body will be taken to the northern city for burial.

### BRAZILIAN POLITICAL BOSS IS ASSASSINATED

RIO JANEIRO, Sept. 9.—The assassination yesterday of Senator Pinheiro Machado has caused a profound sensation throughout Brazil. The Spaniard charged with his murder has confessed, the authorities assert, that he had no accomplices and that he killed Senator Machado because he blamed the politician for misfortunes which had befallen his family.

Pinheiro Machado frequently was referred to as the "political boss" of Brazil. He was president of the senate and leader of the conservatives.

### GERMAN PAPERS UPON REMOVAL OF RUSSIAN LEADER

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—The removal of Grand Duke Nicholas from the position of commander in chief of the Russian armies is the text of long articles in Berlin newspapers this morning. The Tageblatt says the grand duke was removed because, notwithstanding his undeniable gifts in the strategy of retreating, he bears the responsibility for the Russian catastrophes in Poland and Galicia, his influence being shattered in consequence.

**A Generous Tribute**

A view more frequently expressed is that the retirement of the grand duke was dictated by political reasons and aimed particularly at the party represented by the present Russian government, which had grown too strong. The Lokal Anzeiger says the displacement of the grand duke removes the government party's strongest supporter and means a loss to the army, which saw in him the appointed leader. The newspaper pays a frank and generous tribute to the former commander in chief as a brave and honorable enemy and an able leader.

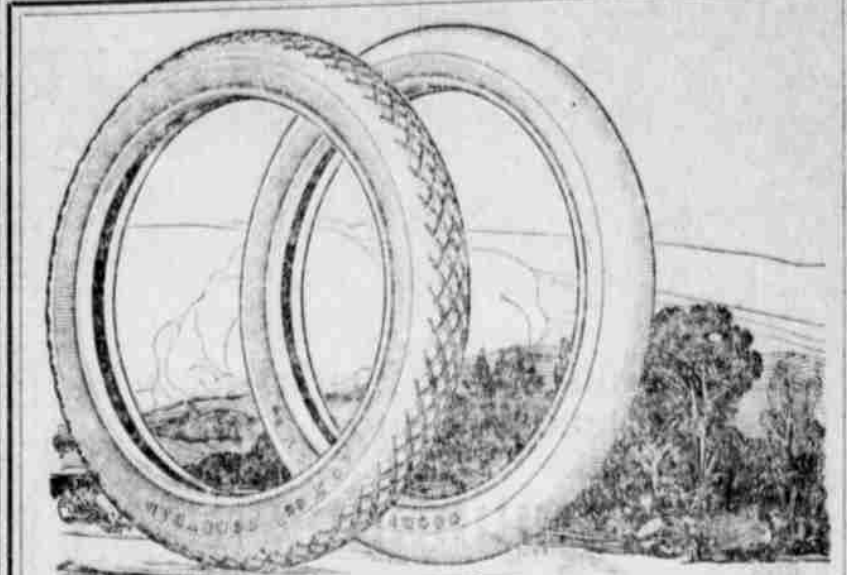
The Morgen Post, on the other hand, terms Grand Duke Nicholas "a brutal and bloody man without leadership talent," and the "destroyer of his army, his land and his people." It adds that the moment demands a leader of titanic strength, and asserts that "this complete elpher as a leader of Russian armies" has been discredited by his defeats.

**Political Significance**

The Vossische Zeitung finds in Emperor Nicholas' move "final proof of the approaching break down of the army and state." It asserts that the government in view of repeated defeats, saw itself compelled to summon new leaders for the army, and the political position of the grand duke made the decision of the emperor easy.

The Boerzen Zeitung views the change as having been directed against certain "ories in the inner political life of Russia."

The Tages Zeitung says: "One hardly errs in ascribing, along with the military significance, just as important political significance to the change."
