

STATE BAPTISTS FAVOR NATION WIDE DRY BELT

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 22.—Promised support of the 'five year objective' of the Northern Baptists convention, a declaration in favor of the passage of the Hobson bill providing for an amendment to the constitution of the United States which brings about national prohibition of the liquor traffic, a pledge for co-operation with other churches in Oregon in obtaining one day of rest in every seven for every man and woman through Sunday closing legislation, and endorsement of the work of the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A. in connection with the University of Oregon were embraced in resolutions adopted by the Oregon Baptist convention here this afternoon.

President Jeff H. Irish of Eugene, was re-elected as president of the convention. Other officers chosen are as follows:

CAROLINE COE'S TWO PERFECT PIES

The cool fall days make the "good wife" think of a little heavier desert. And as the men of all households adore pie, the two recipes given will be helpful and fill a long-felt want.

Lemon Pie
Mix thoroughly 1 cup of sugar and 1 tablespoonful of cornstarch. Add the yolks of 2 eggs and beat until light and foamy. Wash 1 large lemon, grate 1/2 of rind and add to the sugar and egg. Add juice of lemon and just a hint of salt. Put in double boiler with 1 1/2 cups of cold water. Cook until thick and clear, cool and put into rich pie shell. Beat the whites of 2 eggs to stiff dry froth, add 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar and spread over top of pie. Brown lightly in a quick oven.

Cocoanut Pie
One cup of freshly grated cocoanut, two-thirds of a cup of sugar; yolks of 3 eggs beaten together until light; add a little salt and 1 1/2 cupfuls of milk; turn into pie pan lined with rich crust and bake in quick oven 20 minutes. Beat the whites of 2 eggs to stiff dry froth and add 2 tablespoonfuls sugar; spread over pie and set in quick oven to brown. Serve warm. If desiccated cocoanut is used, soak over night in milk.

Mutton en Casserole
Cut in small pieces 2 1/2 pounds of mutton from breast and neck. Season with salt, dredge with flour and put into casserole or deep baking pan. Peel and slice 1 large onion; cut 1 large green sweet pepper into strips and 3 large ripe tomatoes; put vegetables around the meat and add water enough to half cover the meat. Cover and let cook two hours in oven; add 1/2 cup of blanched rice and 1 cup of water and cook another hour; serve in casserole. A fine dish for cold days.

MINING TAX ON PROFITS HURTS BRITISH TRADE

LONDON, Oct. 22, 3:57 p. m.—The new budget, which provides for a super tax of 50 per cent on the profits of all British companies, already has caused the removal to the United States of the headquarters of several companies representing South and Central American gold mines. Mining men here assert that unless the tax is reduced this movement will become so great that New York instead of London will become the mining capital of the world.

The tendency to remove headquarters to the United States is becoming so pronounced that mining interests here are bringing pressure to bear on the chancellor of the exchequer, Reginald McKenna, to have the super tax modified in favor of gold mines.

ARKANSAS LUMBER ORDERED BY CZAR

LITTLE ROCK, Oct. 22.—Arkansas lumber mills will furnish approximately 300,000,000 feet of red oak timber to the Russian government within the next few weeks, it was announced today. General B. W. Green of this city announced he had closed a contract with Russian purchasing agents for six million red oak railroad ties, and L. P. Coleman announced he had secured a contract for a million more. The ties will be used in double tracking the Riga to Moscow railroad.
