

### SERBIAN REPORT DETAILS SEVERE FRONTIER FIGHTING

NIS, Serbia, Oct. 20 (delayed in transmission).—The following Serbian official statement was given out here today:

"The Bulgarians commenced hostilities without a previous declaration of war on October 11. The same day they attacked our positions, penetrating a kilometer into our territory. On the eleventh they attacked and were repulsed.

"On the 13th at 1 o'clock in the morning attacks supported by artillery were pronounced along the whole frontier. The attacks continued on the 14th and in the direction of Kadi Boghaz the Bulgarians penetrated four kilometers into our territory.

"The Bulgarian government declared war only after having succeeded in occupying by surprise the following points along the frontier: Egnagevatz, Krva Planka, Goleche, Orivati, Kamona, Bosovik, Detchani, Gladenatz, Tornj, Vrhvina, Gniva, Devehair and Bogadaritza.

"On the 15th of October the Bulgarians successfully assaulted our positions east and southwest of Zetchar. Severe fighting took place southeast of Egnagevatz and in the direction of the passage of St. Nicholas.

"On the 16th of October there was fierce fighting near Zaetchar, around Svnki, which was taken and retaken."

### CORNELL EASILY DEFEATS HARVARD

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Oct. 23.—Cornell completely outplayed Harvard today and made a 10 to 0 victory on a touchdown and a field goal. Taking advantage of crimson errors which gave Cornell the ball on the twenty-yard line, the Ithacans scored a touchdown in the first two minutes of play. Captain Barrett earned the ball over and kicked the goal. Five minutes later he was kicked in the head and left the game.

In the fourth period Cornell clinched the victory when Shiverick kicked a field goal from the 42-yard line. Harvard was never within twenty-five yards of Cornell's goal.

In the last period Harvard was unable to make any long gains except in the final two minutes of play, and then only reached midfield. Neither side showed any intricate attack.

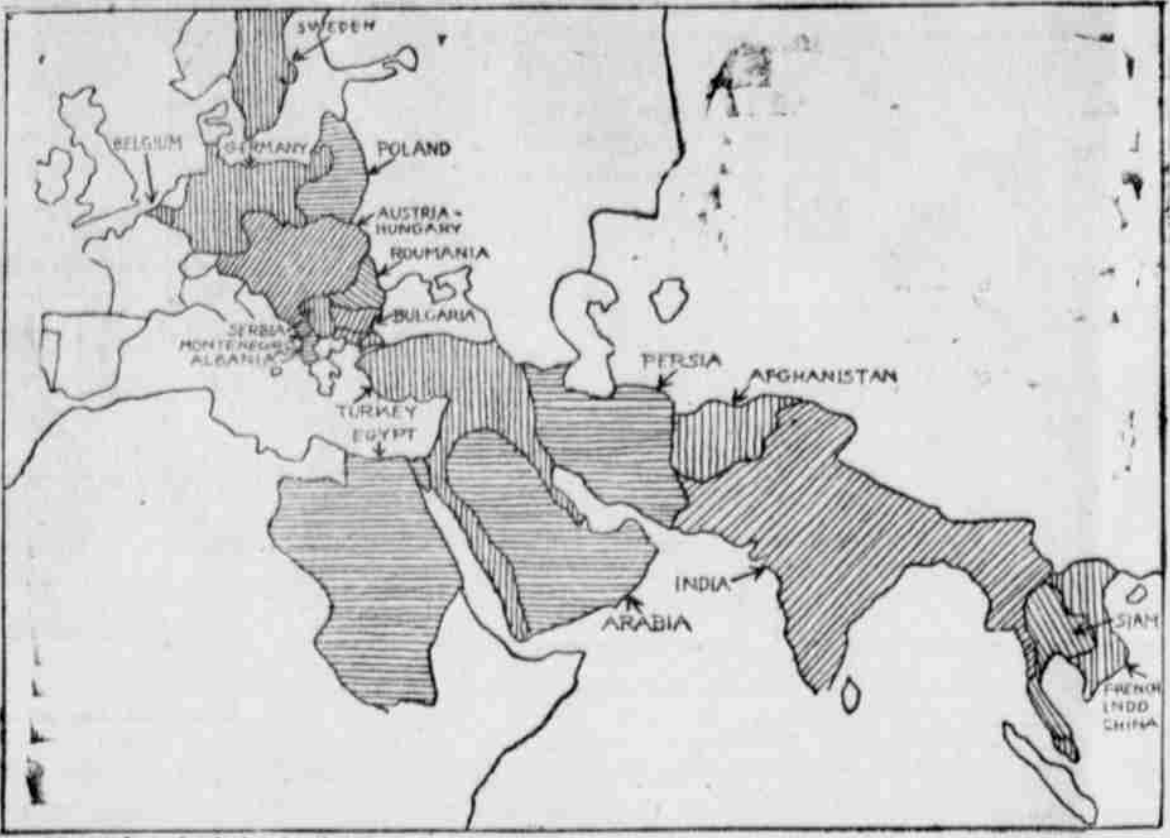
### 289 BRITISH SHIPS SUNK BY SUBMARINES

BERLIN, Oct. 23 (by wireless to Sayville).—Competent German authorities deny the official announcement made in London on October 20 that only 183 British merchant vessels and 175 British fishing vessels had been sunk by submarines up to October 14, says the Overseas News agency. "These authorities state that up to the middle of October 289 English trading vessels had been destroyed as shown by the statements published from time to time in English newspapers. These reports do not disclose all the facts and the actual number of ships sunk in reality is still larger."

### WORLD'S GREATEST EMPIRE UNDER TEUTONIC RULE—IF KAISER WINS CAMPAIGN



The stakes the Kaiser is playing for: The empire which the German ruler, by the aid of his Turkish allies and his secret diplomacy among all the Mohammedan peoples, expects to gain at the end of the world war. Note that it contains the Dardanelles and the Suez canal. The area of the territory is 4,996,613 square miles. The area of the British empire now is 11,167,294 square miles, but 1,941,163 of this would be lost to Germany, leaving 9,226,131.

### MUST PAY DUTY ON MEXICAN GOODS

EL PASO, Tex., Oct. 23.—Unless duty is paid to the Mexican consular representative of the de facto government of General Carranza, all shipments out of Mexico through this port and customs district will be attacked for such custom duties, it was announced here today.

The announcement in effect is regarded here as embargo against shipments in the interior and applies equally to legitimate as well as confiscated goods, where duty has been paid, to the Villa officers and not duplicated to the de facto government's officials.

### MERLIN NEARLY DESTROYED BY FIRE

Merlin, a small settlement nine miles north of Grants Pass, was almost wiped out by fire early today. The fire started in the Merlin hotel building, supposedly from a defective fuse.

In addition to the hotel, the Southern Pacific depot, the stores of William Richards and D. W. Mitchell, a blacksmith shop and several houses were destroyed. The flames cut off telegraph communication.

A car of merchandise on the Southern Pacific siding, consisting of 30,000 pounds of small packages, was also destroyed.

The loss on the buildings is estimated at \$10,000, half covered by insurance. No estimate is given of the railroad loss.

### FERDINAND'S NEPHEW BLINDED BY WOMAN

ROME, Oct. 23.—Prince Leopold of Coburg, a nephew of King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, was burned with acid and wounded with a revolver by a woman friend, the daughter of a Viennese police captain, according to a dispatch from Vienna. It is stated that the woman committed suicide by shooting. The condition of the prince is most grave and he is likely to lose his sight, it is said.

### MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR EXECUTED NURSE

LONDON, Oct. 23.—The memorial service for Miss Cavell, the British nurse who was executed by the German authorities in Brussels, which was meant to be an unobtrusive tribute, is developing national proportions. Premier Asquith and other members of the cabinet have announced their intention of being present at St. Paul's cathedral on Friday when the service will be held and public bodies and the leading hospitals throughout the country will send delegations.

### ITALIANS ATTACK ALL ALONG LINE IN NEW EFFORTS

UDINE, Italy, Oct. 23.—The Italian army is making a general attack along the whole line from Switzerland to the Adriatic. In the preceding five months of the Austro-Italian war, the efforts of the Italian have been directed at the penetration of Austrian territory and capture of strategic points for the purpose of securing Italy against the possibility of Austrian invasion. In the opinion of the Italian general staff this has been accomplished and the war is now entering its second phase.

It is estimated the Italians have taken 25,000 prisoners during the war and have put out of action upward of 100,000 men in all. Italian losses, including killed, wounded and prisoners, amount to about 45,000, according to official figures, which is the lowest percentage of any of the belligerent nations.
