It was the dryest October since 1895, when no rain fell at all, and with .03 rainfall the dryest September since 1889. Without an exception, it has been the dryest fall since weather records were kept in Medford, beginnong in 1889.

The seasonal deficiency to November 1 (the season is computed from September 1) is 2.08 inches. A year ago at this date there was a seasonal excess of .45 inch, yet in spite of this promising beginning the season was the record dry one.

The average annual rainfall for November is 3.88 inches. The month formerly was a wet one, but of recent years has tapered off into the dry column.
