

8500 SERBIANS CAPTURED BY INVADING ARMY

German Report Claims Serbians Are Driven Back All Along Line—Russians Defeated Along Styr River in Galicia, But Begin New Offensive East of Vilna.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—Capture of 8500 Serbians is reported by German headquarters in today's official statement. The Bulgarian forces operating in Serbia took 7000 of these, together with seven cannon. The Serbians continue to be driven back all along the line, it is announced.

Berlin claims somewhat decided success for German arms along the Styr river, General Von Linsingen's troops having cleared the entire western banks of the river of Russians, it is declared.

New Offensive Begun
The Russians appear to have begun an offensive movement in a new region, the German war office reporting Russian attacks near Smorgon, east of Vilna, which were repulsed.

In the latest official report by the Italian general staff progress for the Italians in the fighting on the Isonzo front is claimed.

Saloniki hears that German submarines are using the Bulgarian harbor of Varna on the Black sea as a base of operations. Varna has been mentioned as one of the harbors where Russia would be likely to land troops for an invasion of Bulgaria.

On Western Line
One the western front, says Berlin, the Germans stormed a French trench 300 yards long, northeast of Bourle.

PARIS, Nov. 15.—The French war office this afternoon gave out a report on the progress of hostilities in the east which reads: "November 14 we made progress to the north of Radvova. Bulgarian troops delivered a violent attack along the entire front of the left bank of the river Cerna. They were driven back with heavy losses."

VILLA ATTACKS HERMOSILLO WITH ARMY OF 11,000

NOGALES, Ariz., Nov. 15.—Carlos Randall, Villa governor of Sonora, announced today that General Villa and the Yaqui chief, Urbalejo had attacked Hermosillo today with their combined forces. The last Villa troops evacuated Naco yesterday. Hermosillo, according to Carranza officials, is occupied by General Manuel Diez, with 8000 men. Villa is said to have about 11,000 men, including Urbalejo's force of 1500 Yaquis.

Carlos Lynns, said to be an American citizen from El Paso, was held by United States military authorities here today on complaint of Carranza officials, who declared Lynns was a Villa officer. Lynns asserted he was a buyer of hides.

LIQUOR SHIPMENTS MUST BE LABELLED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—The supreme court held today that a man who ships liquor from one state to another without labeling it as such in violation of law may be prosecuted in either state. It reversed the judgment of the Kansas federal court, which quashed an indictment against Joseph Freeman and remanded the case for prosecution. Freeman was charged with shipping trunks full of liquor unlabelled from Joplin, Mo., to Cherokee, Kan.

BRITAIN REFUSES TO RECOGNIZE SHIP SALES

LONDON, Nov. 15.—Lord Robert Cecil, parliamentary under secretary for foreign affairs, said in the house of commons today that the government was not prepared to recognize and respect sales of interned German steamships to citizens of a neutral state.

The under secretary said he had no knowledge of negotiations for the sale of all German steamships lying in neutral ports, although from time to time he had heard of negotiations for the purchase of particular vessels.

NEW ORLEANS ROAD SOLD AT AUCTION

NEW ORLEANS, La., Nov. 15.—The New Orleans, Texas and Mexico railroad, a subsidiary of the St. Louis and San Francisco system, was sold at public auction here today by order of Judge Rufus Foster of the federal court to Walter L. Taylor, representing the bondholders for \$6,000,000.

ITALIANS REPORT PROGRESS ALONG BATTLE FRONT

ROME, Nov. 15.—The following statement was issued today at the headquarters of the Italian general staff:

"In the Ledro valley enemy artillery opened an intense fire against our positions without damaging our solid defenses.

"On the Isonzo front we progressed on Javorek, in the Plezzo basin and on the heights northwest of Gorizia.

"On the Carso plateau we have taken strong entrenchments called Delle Frasse to the southwest of San Martino.

"Our aeroplanes on the 12th, notwithstanding bad weather, made successful raids over the Carso. They bombarded the railroad stations at Reichenberg, San Daniels, Syppe and Dottedino and long lines of trains standing at the stations. Twenty enemy machines of the Albatross type and one of the Aviatik type, which were met on the way, were put to flight by machine-gun fire. Our machines returned undamaged."
