

### GERMANS CAPTURE TOWNS OF PRISTINA AND NITROVITSA

BERLIN, Nov. 24.—The Serbian towns of Nitrovitsa and Pristina have been captured, the war office announced today.

The text of the statement as given out by the German army headquarters staff today follows:

"In the eastern theater: Army group of Field Marshal Von Hindenburg: Southeast of Riga an attack upon Bersaminde was made by the Russians from Demorte. We captured six officers and 700 men. An advance post in Janopol, north of Ilouksti, withdrew before a Russian attack, but on a counter-attack the village was recaptured.

"Army group of General Von Linsingen: Russian attacks northeast of Czartorysk and near Sabiszew were repulsed. Fifty prisoners were taken.

"In the Balkan theater: Mitrovitsa has been taken by Austro-Hungarian troops. Pristina has been taken by German troops. The Serbians have been driven over the Sitnica river, west of Pristina."

### ENGLAND WILL BE READY NEXT MARCH

PARIS, Nov. 24.—Earl Kitchener the British secretary for war, in conversation with Greek officials in his recent visit to Athens, is reported to have declared that England will have by next March four million soldiers under arms and will be in a position to arm and provision six million Russians and that consequently it would show great stupidity to think the war would end otherwise than in complete defeat for Germany.

This information is contained in an Athens dispatch to the Havas Agency which adds that Lord Kitchener admitted that the declaration of war found the entente powers insufficiently prepared for so long a campaign but said that the allies had known how to utilize the time that has since elapsed to complete their military preparedness.

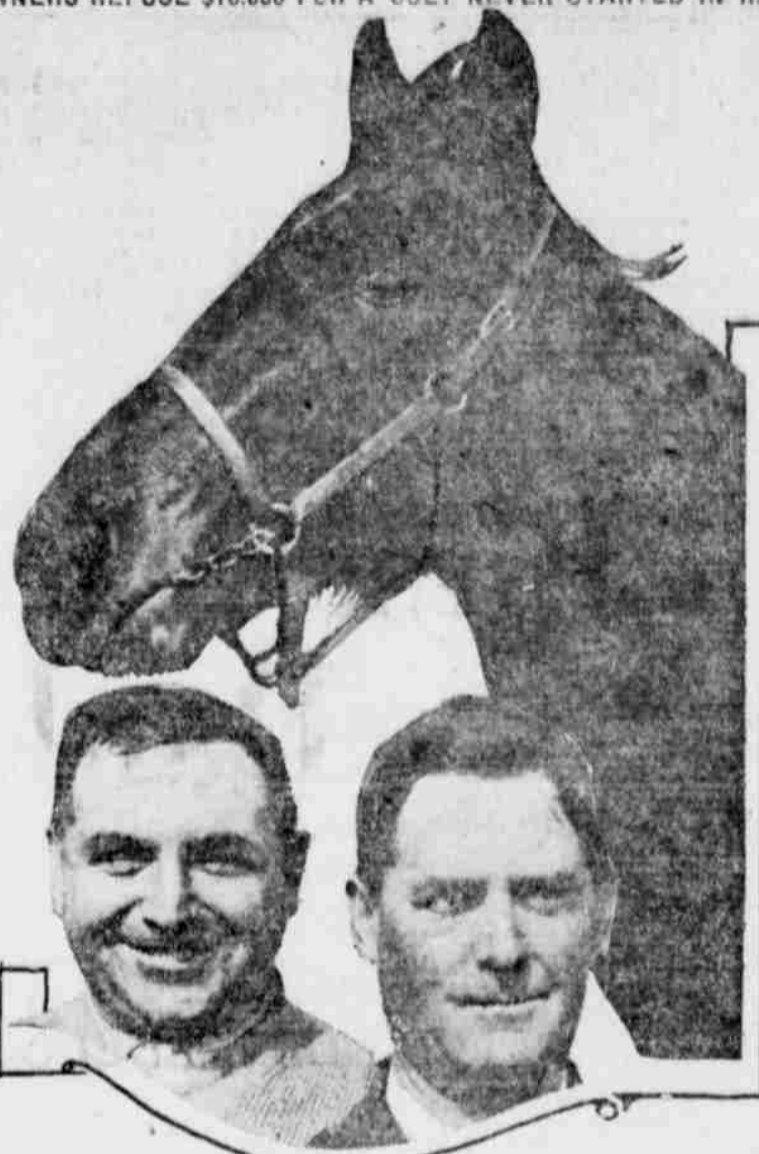
### Union Thanksgiving Service

### SOUTHERN PACIFIC SHOWS AN INCREASE

This is the largest gain for that month in the history of the road and is in keeping with returns recently made by other large transportation companies, especially in the west and northwest.

### FIRST SUBMARINE FOUND AT CHICAGO

CHICAGO, Nov. 24.—The submarine "Fulkler," which has been missing for twenty-five years, has been found at the bottom of the Chicago river.

The "Fulkler" was so called because it first made its appearance shortly after the great Chicago fire in 1871, when submarines were untried and drowned its original owner when it made a trial trip.

Divers found the craft. The boat is cigar shaped, about forty feet in length and five feet wide. It was so constructed that it sank until all that was un-submerged was an air pipe.

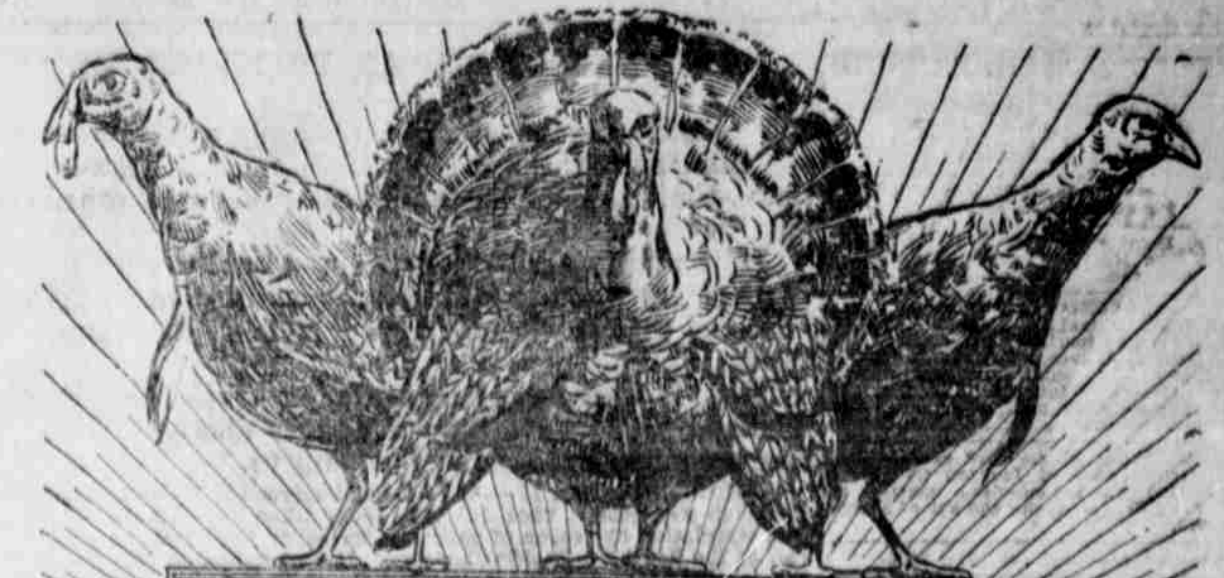

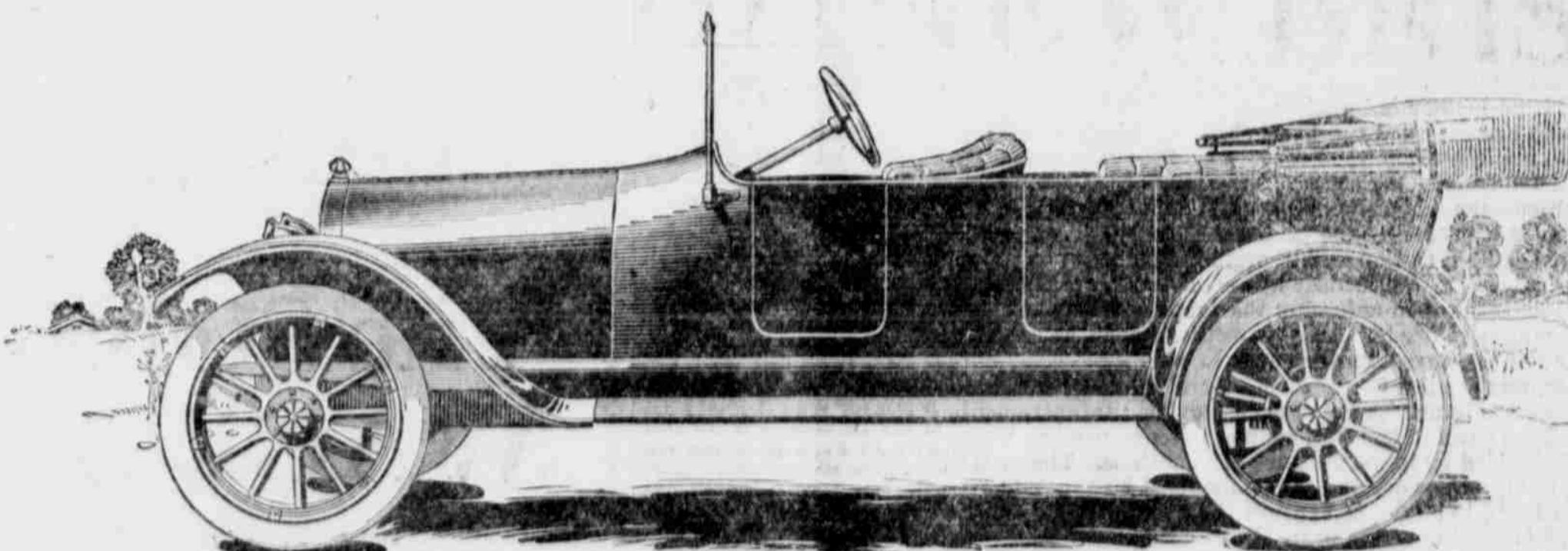
