TEXAS FATHER JAILED FOR DAUGHTER'S MURDER

PARIS, Texas, Dec. 20.—T. R. Walton, father of Pauline Walton, 17, murdered in bed at her home Saturday, was arrested today and formally charged with the murder of his daughter.

The arrest was made shortly after 1 a. m. nearly the entire sheriff's constables and police forces participating. This was done, it was said, as a precautionary measure for fear of mob violence.

Walton, at daylight, was taken away by officers on a southbound train.

NOTICE

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 234, General Laws of Oregon, 1913, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court room of the Courthouse in the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, on Thursday, the 30th day of December, 1915, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimate of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Jackson County.

The County Court has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of county government, county offices or county officer, each county improvement, the maintenance of each county building, structure or institution, the salary of each county officer or employe, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants, and estimate of the probable receipts of the county from sources other than direct taxation upon the real and personal property in the county during the period for which such tax is to be levied, and the amount of balances on hand in the funds of the county at the time the levy will be made.

For payment of the following separate items of expense: Pacific Highway Road Interest Fund, \$25,000.00; General Road Fund, \$37,200.00; County School Fund, \$62,000.00; School and Library Fund, \$750.00; High School Fund, \$17,850.00.

1. Naturalized citizens must exhibit "Final" citizenship papers. 2. If the father of an alien became naturalized before he (the child) became of age, he is a naturalized citizen, but must exhibit the father's papers or a copy of the same from the court issuing them.

3. A foreign woman, married to a citizen of the United States, is a citizen. 4. An American woman who marries a foreigner, takes the nationality of her husband, and must exhibit his papers if he becomes a naturalized citizen; at the termination of the marital relation, if she continues to reside here, she may resume her citizenship.

5. Foreign-born unmarried women must be naturalized themselves after they become 21 years of age, or by their father before they become of age; if married to a foreigner who is
