EL PASO, Tex., Jan: 12-With the expected arrival here today of the bodies of the eighteen foreigners, San Ysabel, fifty miles from Chihuahua City, full details of the tragedy were eagerly awaited.

Final checking up by the American employes shows eighteen foreigners unaccounted for. Nineteen were reported to have been on the train, only one of whom, Thomas M. Holmes, escaped. Following is the revised list issued by the smelling company:



In retallation he demanded

that Americans in Mexico be killed and their property destroyed.
