Mr. Folger tarried a day or two in El Paso, going over the river into Juarez, Mexico, for a brief visit, but he found nothing there to suggest that he prolong his stay on that side of the line. He was there on the night before the massacre of eighteen Americans near Chihuahua. "Americans ought to keep out of Mexico during the reign of guerrilla butchery down there," said Mr. Folger. "It is like inviting sure destruction to go among those savage, war-crazed people now."

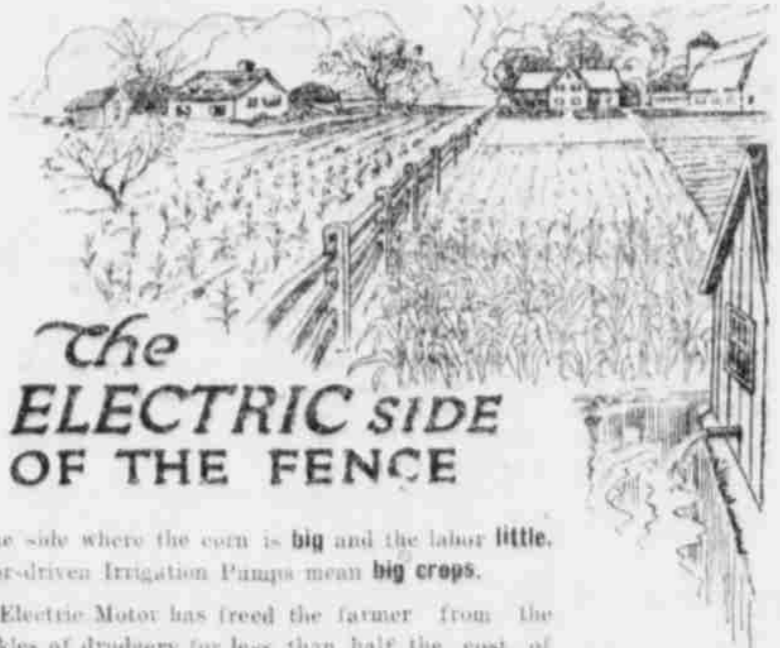
