COUNTY COURT NAMES 1916 OFFICIAL PAPERS

At the meeting of the county court Friday the Daily Mail Tribune and Ashland Times were appointed official papers of Jackson county, in compliance with the statutes.

The Daily Mail Tribune submitted affidavits of circulation of 2492, Bert H. Greer in a letter filed with the court, claimed a circulation of exceeding 1600, but when a sworn statement was demanded filed an affidavit dated January 19 of 1197 circulation.

No price was named by the Tribunes, but the Mail Tribune offered to do the printing for 2 1/2 cents per line, one-half the legal rate, and this price was named for both papers in the court's order.
