NOTICE OF DELINQUENT SECOND HALF TAXES

The following list of real property situated in Jackson county, Oregon, is hereby advertised for delinquent second half taxes assessed for the year 1914.

This advertisement is authorized by an act embodied in chapter 392 of the General Laws of Oregon as passed by the 1913 session of the legislative assembly.

The taxes of the following advertised list of real property became delinquent on October 1, 1915, and are subject to a penalty of 10 per cent per annum at the rate of 15 per cent per annum until the said taxes shall have been paid.

Notice is hereby given that no person is to be charged against the following real estate becoming delinquent upon demand, from the date of delinquency against the said property for delinquent taxes. The certificate of delinquency will bear interest at the rate of 15 per cent per annum until the certificate is redeemed.

Any time after the expiration of three years from the first date of the delinquency of any tax included in a certificate of delinquency, no such certificate may cause summons to be served on the owner of the property described in the certificate, nor may the owner be held liable for the amount of the county in which the property is situated, or for the delinquency of a lien against the property, or for the same, in such certificate.
