ATTACK IS LED BY VILLA IN PERSON

EL PASO, Tex., Feb. 4.—Juarez, the Mexican border town opposite here, was completely isolated today from communication with Chihuahua City as the result of the attack yesterday by Francisco Villa upon the garrison at Moctezuma, about 100 miles south of here. Beyond establishing the fact that Villa himself led the attack on Moctezuma, no news was received at military headquarters to indicate how the fight at Moctezuma progressed. Troops under General Herrera were hurrying from Chihuahua City to attack Villa.

CANAL RE-OPENING INDEFINITE--GOETHALS

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—Governor Goethals of the Panama canal zone told the house appropriations committee today that the slides in the big waterway were not caused, as had been said, by turning the water in before the canal was completed. SWISS BRING DOWN ITALIAN AIRSHIP

GENEVA, Switzerland, Feb. 4, via Paris.—An Italian observation aeroplane of a new type yesterday flew over Lugano and the Swiss positions on Monte Cenero. A violent fire was directed by Swiss guns at the aeroplane, which was hit repeatedly. The aviator, who was not injured, was forced to land within Swiss territory. He was made prisoner. The aviator said he had flown over Swiss territory by mistake.

SALAZAR QUILTS SURRENDERS FORCE

MONTEREY, Mexico, Feb. 4.—Belief that organized opposition to the de facto government in the state of Vera Cruz was ended was stated today by Carranza officials upon receipt of news of the surrender of General Vincente Salazar with 400 men. Salazar stated the only remaining opposition consisted of ex-federals. Officials said Carranza forces held all important points.

TO BAR PAPAL DELEGATES FROM PEACE CONFERENCE

ROME, Feb. 4.—The question as to whether the pope will be authorized to send delegates to the peace conference, which is expected to be held at the conclusion of the war, is raised again by Count Soderini, a member of the Italian chamber of deputies and the man to whom Pope Leo XIII entrusted with the documents from which the history of his pontificate was to be written. Count Soderini said that Pope Benedict since he has been elected to the papacy has always aimed at the conclusion of a joint and lasting peace.

FIVE PERISH IN HOTEL HOLOCAUST AT ATLANTIC CITY

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Feb. 4.—Five persons lost their lives and eight others were seriously injured early today in a fire which destroyed the Overbrook hotel in this city. Several of the injured are expected to die. The fire is believed to have started in the kitchen. There were not many guests in the house and most of them were aroused in time to escape. Their exit was cut off and most of them had to jump from windows. One woman was seen to faint after calling for help from an upper window and was burned to death while her body lay across the sill in view of hundreds of persons unable to help her. The engineer of the hotel hung out of a window until the fire reached his hands and caused him to drop to the street. He was killed. Another woman who managed to crawl out of the window fell and also lost her life. The bodies still in the ruins are those of the parents of Richard Mott, proprietor of the hotel, and Paul Hendricks of Chambersburg, Pa.
