BRITISH BUDGET FOR WAR NINE

LONDON, April 4.—The introduction in the house of commons of the fourth budget of the war, which is set for today, has brought back to London numbers from throughout the country and a full attendance is expected when Reginald McKenna, chancellor of the exchequer, takes the floor to explain figures which will be greater than those which any previous chancellor has had to present. It has been virtually accepted by the house that Mr. McKenna will propose a further tax increase, and the chief interest in this connection is centered on the form which the taxation will take.

Expectations are for a hadget totalling at least 1,800,000,000 pounds sterling, as this amount will be needed by Great Britain to meet the expenses if the present rate of expenditure is continued throughout the financial year which has just opened. This amount is nine times the untional expenditure in the last completed year of peace.
