New Way to Make Apple Dumplings

Served With Hard Sauce or Cream and Sugar. By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine. Here is a new way to make apple dumplings that will surely please every housewife, for it is not necessary to have whole apples, and the juice cannot run out and burn as with apple dumplings where the apple is placed in the center and the dough turned up around it. The biscuit part forms a crispy shell that holds the apples and juice.



One and one-half cups sifted flour; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 3 level teaspoonsful K. C. baking powder; 1/2 cup shortening; 1/2 cup milk; 1/2 cup apples. Fill the cups of a buttered muffin pan with pared and sliced apples, sprinkle with salt and turn two or three table-spoonsful of water into each cup. Sift together, three times, the flour, salt and baking powder; work in the shortening, and mix to a soft dough with the milk. Drop the dough from a spoon with the apples in the center, giving it a smooth exterior. Let bake about twenty-five minutes. Invert the pan on a large serving-dish. Put a spoonful of hard sauce above the apple in each dumpling and finish with a grating of nutmeg.

Notice is hereby given, that the following is a full and correct copy of the title and text of a certain Act of Municipal Legislation amending the charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, to be submitted to the legal voters of said city for their adoption or rejection at a special election to be held in and for said city on the 23rd day of May, 1916, together with the numbers and form in which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot. Dated April 25, 1916. (Signed) ELMER T. FOSS, Recorder of the City of Medford, Oregon.

Proposed Charter Amendment of the Charter of the City of Medford, Oregon.

To enable and empower the city council of said city, for and on behalf, and for the benefit and use of the inhabitants of said city, and for profit, to build, equip, acquire, lease, own and operate railways, operated by steam, electric or other power, within and without the boundaries of the said city and running from a point within the city of Medford to other towns, cities and points without the boundaries of the said city, and to that end may acquire rights-of-way, easements and real property within and without the boundaries of said city for any such purpose, and to create a railway construction, maintenance and redemption fund, and to authorize a millage tax to provide the same; to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds, not to exceed \$200,000 in addition to the warrants and bonds authorized in sections 72 and 72a of said charter; to provide that the bonds authorized herein shall be redeemed by a special and limited tax levy in addition to the limitations of indebtedness provided by the city charter.

The People of the City of Medford Do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That the charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto the following sections: Section 129. The City of Medford, under the powers vested in it by the general laws of Oregon enacted by legislature of the session of 1913, chapter 282, as amended by chapter 105 of the General Laws of Oregon of the session for the year 1915, and the city council, under the powers vested in it by the city charter, and particularly section 25 of said charter, and in addition to its powers by virtue of section 65 of said charter, may levy a special railway building, equipping and operating tax on the taxable property within the corporate limits of the city of the amount of making out the annual budget as provided for by this charter and as part of the total city levy.

Said tax levy shall be special and in addition to the ten (10) mill tax limitation contained in section 65 of this charter, and the money from said special levy shall be kept in a separate fund and be used for the redemption purposes of the bonds hereinauthorized, and for no other purpose. In addition to all warrants and bonds authorized to be issued by sections 72 and 72a of this charter, the city council of the city of Medford is hereby further authorized and empowered to borrow money on the faith and credit of said city, and for that purpose to issue bonds and warrants in the manner provided by section 72 of this charter for the sole purpose of obtaining the said sum of \$200,000 to build, equip, acquire, lease, own and operate railways, operated by steam, electric or other power within or without the boundaries of the said city for the benefit and use of the inhabitants of Medford, Oregon, for profit, and running from a point within the city of Medford to other towns, cities, and points without the boundaries of the said city, and to that end may acquire rights-of-way, easements, real property, or lease, within and without its boundaries for any such purpose.

That the said city council is hereby authorized and empowered to receive proposals for the construction of any such railway or railways for and on behalf of said city and to adopt the same; provided, however, that no such proposal or contract shall be made upon the city and the same shall have been submitted at a special or general election to the qualified voters of said city and duly approved by a majority vote of the qualified electors of said city.

The following is the form in which the foregoing measure will appear upon the ballot.

1. To amend the charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, to provide for the construction of railways from a point within the city of Medford to other towns, cities, and points without the boundaries of the said city, and to that end may acquire rights-of-way, easements, real property, or lease, within and without its boundaries for any such purpose.
