

### REVOLT IN IRELAND PLANNED INFLUENCE OPINION IN AMERICA

LONDON, April 28.—The German press has not been permitted to comment on the Sir Roger Casement incident, but prints telegrams from Dutch papers with regard to the trouble in Ireland, says the correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph company at Amsterdam.

The Cologne Volks Zeitung is quoted by the correspondent as saying that the situation in Ireland must be watched by Germany, especially in view of the present American crisis. Had the adventure succeeded, declares the newspapers, it would have had immense effect in America on the feeling towards Germany.

LONDON, April 28.—"The Cologne Gazette appears to expect no losses from the Sinn Fein revolt in Ireland," Renter's Amsterdam correspondent telegraphs.

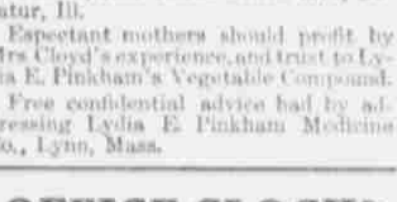

### MEXICAN REBEL BANDS SURRENDER

WASHINGTON, April 28.—Many revolutionary bands in the Laguna district of Coahuila and the eastern part of Durango are reported in dispatches to the state department today to have surrendered to the Carranza government.

"The department," said an official announcement, "is in receipt of telegraphic advices stating that it is reliably reported that since the arrival of Torreon of General Jacinto Trevino conditions have greatly improved in the Laguna district. Good order is said to have been restored in that part of Coahuila and in the eastern portion of Durango. In these sections many Villa or revolutionary bands are reported to have surrendered to the de facto government. It is further reported that in General Trevino's district the people are calm and friendly toward Americans and other foreigners."
