HAVER MOVES MILL TO GRANTS PASS

A sawmill of 30,000 daily capacity is to be the first great industry to be established in Grants Pass.

The company that is bringing the mill to Grants Pass is to be under the management of Edgar Haver of Medford, who has associated himself with representatives of the Trask company. The mill is one that was shipped the first instance to Bull Falls about four years ago, and was to have been moved to cut the fire timber there in the last interests.

About the time the mill arrived Mr. Haver died and the estate was closed up without putting the mill into operation. It was taken over by the Haver family, by whom it has now been transferred to the new company, which is moving it from Jackson county to Jackson county.
