TABLES issued by the federal bureau of commerce show that the United States is the greatest producing nation in the world, both in metals and in food prod-

The United States stands first among nations in its output of coal, iron and steel, copper, petroleum and silver. In gold production, it is second, with South Africa first,

This nation leads, too, in cotton, corn, wheat, oats, apples, bay and tobacco. In sugar, Cuba leads, with Germany second and the United States third,

The United States produces 40 per cent of the world's iron output, 50 per cent of its copper, 60 per cent of its petroleum, 50 per cent of its cotton, 25 per cent of its silver, 25 per cent of its wheat, 60 per cent of its corn, 30 per cent of its oats and 60 per cent of its tobacco.
