MEDFORD PICNIC AT LITHIA PARK

President A. L. Hill, of the Commercial club, yesterday appointed George T. Collins, C. M. Kidd and E. T. Schmidt as a committee to organize the details of the "Medford Day" picnic proposed to be held in Lithia park at Ashland some day in the near future. Ashland has extended the invitation to towns along the Southern Pacific into California and north to Portland to join these picnic gatherings in that park. Medford Day will be given a date by the committee. It may be that it will fall on the date on which a number of the communities invited will attend, in which event Lithia park will have a "capacity house."

ZEPPELIN WINGED BY BRITISH CRUISER

LONDON, May 5.—A Zeppelin dirigible balloon was destroyed yesterday by one of the British light cruiser squadrons off the Schleswig coast says an official announcement issued by the government today.
This is the second Zeppelin to be destroyed in two days. The Zeppelin L-29 was blown ashore on the Norwegian coast on Wednesday after returning from a raid on the east coast of England and Scotland Tuesday night. When the disabled balloon began to be carried away against a strong wind, the Norwegian military authorities at Stuvanger blew up the air vessel.

FOUR HENS LAY 257 EGGS IN THREE MONTHS

Published records of industrious hens in other localities are stimulating local poultry keepers to take better care of their flocks and to watch the results more closely. Heretofore, little publicity has been given locally to such matters because those who have thoroughbred chickens have failed to make public the results of proper care of their flocks. To do so, however, is educational and encouraging. It prompts others to excel. Such rivalry is always productive of good results—and more eggs. It also encourages the production of better chickens. It is the better chickens that produce the profits in the poultry business.
Mrs. Darnell, 511 South Riverside avenue, has four hens that have been profitably busy for the past three months. They have produced 257 eggs since February 1st—three months. That is 64 eggs to the hen, or 21 eggs a month each. These hens were 8 months old.
That is a good record. The eggs of these four hens for that period are worth about \$5. That is \$1.25 to the hen, produced in three months. Does the backyard poultry flock pay?
