The acid test of Rockefeller's real purpose in establishing the foundation is "who controls the money?"

If it was in truth a gift to the American people, to be expended for the welfare of mankind, the fonds would have been placed under the control of the wisest and most experienced men in the nation.

But Rockefeller placed the absolute control of the \$100,000,000 in the hands of a financial committee composed of his son, John D. Rockefeller Jr., and his personal attorney, Starr J. Murphy, and an ex-private secre tary, Jerome D. Greene. When appointed, these three men were the 'personal staff' of John D. Rockefeller. Greene has since been removed to make room for Ivy Lee, Rockefeller's press agent!

Rockefeller, Murphy and Green are also a majority and quorum of the executive committe, which controls all activities of the foundation.
