BATTLE OF GETTYSBURG NOW STAGE OF WAR

PARIS June 8.—General Joffre, the French commander in chief, today received at army headquarters President H. Allen of New York, who has been identified with relief work and after expressing his high appreciation of American sympathy and the aid extended to the French wounded, talked in an interesting manner on the several phases of the war.

THE SUGAR FACTORY LOCATION

IN the telegram received from George E. Sanders relating the sale of the Utah-Oregon Sugar company, light is thrown upon the reasons why the factory was located at Grants Pass instead of Medford. Mr. Sanders says:

To obtain the factory at Grants Pass, Mr. Sanders and his associates in the Rogue River Public Service corporation, a Grants Pass institution, guaranteed the bond issue of the sugar company, and secured the Oregon-Utah Sugar company a valuable factory site at a nominal consideration, and subscribed for fifty thousand dollars of the said bond issue, and Mr. Sanders says that he, himself, and his immediate associates are now also raising over 100 acres of beets.

Yet Alex. Nibley and his associates in the promotion of the factory, knowing that the factory was assured Grants Pass because of the stock subscription and site subsidy, deliberately assured the business men and farmers of Medford and vicinity that the factory would be located where the greatest acreage of sugar beets was secured, and that the factory would be located in Medford provided the bulk of the acreage was signed here.

When the required acreage had been pledged by the Medford area and it was ascertained that the factory would go to Grants Pass, regardless of the location of beet acreage, in violation of the promises made, a natural resentment arose against the double-crossing methods of promoters and caused the cancellation of the bulk of the acreage signed. The promise had been made simply as a bait to secure the co-operation of Medford people in signing acreage, with no intention of being fulfilled.

Had the promoters frankly taken the public into their confidence, explained why it was necessary to locate the factory at Grants Pass, a greater actual acreage would be in beets today and there would have been no hard feelings over labor lost in a false cause. The operators would have had the good will of the community.

According to Mr. Sanders, the promotion has been exceedingly profitable to the promoters, who have already cashed in their prospective profits, realizing from 200 to 800 per cent profit, besides aiding their other investments. Yet the location at Grants Pass was a strategical mistake, as shown by the fact that the operators must pay freight on beets from an area extending from Oakland on the north to Ashland on the south in order to secure the required quantity of beets.

THE LAND GRANT MONEY

UNDER the terms of the O. & C. land grant bill as passed by congress, if ratified by the supreme court bill, the counties of Oregon containing railroad grant land will eventually realize \$11,000,000 for use in highway construction or port improvements. The amounts each county will secure are as follows:

The money will be received in dribslets, as the property is sold, and it will probably be years before the total amount is secured. The disposition of the money is left to the county courts and can be spent as received or handled as the state school fund is handled, as a trust fund, the money being loaned and the interest only being spent as a continuing appropriation for road construction and maintenance.

If handled as a trust fund, the \$2,342,915 which Jackson county will eventually receive would yield an annual income of approximately \$140,000 a year, which sum is double that spent this year on roads. If the principal was spent, it would mean the improvement of all our highways. Both plans have their advocates and opponents. The question will be whether we desire to benefit the present or the future.

However, the money hasn't been received yet and will not be for some years, and there is plenty of time to discuss its expenditure when it is.

force from others respect for its own rights, then sooner or later we shall have to submit to the will of an alien conqueror. For two years, in the face of the awful world cataclysm, this nation has stood supine and helpless and has not in the smallest degree prepared itself to ward off the danger. No promise, no excuse now made by those responsible for this inaction is entitled to serious consideration. It is for you and your associates to show the people that they have a worthy alternative to which to turn. The professional German-Americans, acting through various agencies, including so-called German-American alliances, are at this moment serving notice on the members

of your convention that your action must be taken with a view to the interests, not of the United States, but of Germany and of that section of the German-American vote which is anti-American to the core.

Grills German-Americans

"I believe with all my heart that the action of those sinister professional German-Americans will be repudiated with angry contempt by the great mass of our fellow-citizens who are in whole or in part of German blood—and who, as I well know, are un-American in rugged and whole-souled Americanism by any other citizens of our land. But the professional German-Americans are seeking to terrorize your convention; for they wish to elect next November a man who shall not be, in good faith, an American president, but the viceroy of a foreign government. It is for your convention in emphatic fashion to repudiate them. This can be done in effective manner only by such action as to enable republicans, progressives, democrats who are true to the principles of Andrew Jackson, the independents—in short, all loyal Americans—to join in the effort to reach the goal we all have in view.

"Can we not, forgetting past differences, now join, for the safety and honor of our country, to enforce the policies of genuine Americanism and genuine preparedness? Surely we can afford to act in accordance with the words of Abraham Lincoln when he said: 'May not all having a common interest reunite in a common effort to save our common country? May we ask those who have not differed with us to join in this same spirit toward those who have?' "As far as my soul is known to me it is in this same spirit that at this time I make my appeal to republicans and progressives assembled at Chicago. (Signed.) "THEODORE ROOSEVELT."

LONDON, June 8.—David Lloyd-George, minister of munitions was only prevented from accompanying Lord Kitchener on his ill-fated trip on the cruiser Hampshire by the Irish crisis, according to statements in political circles here today. It had been arranged that Lloyd-George should accompany the minister of war to Russia but the sudden call upon the Welsh statesman to mediate between the Irish factions upset this plan. The place was taken by other representatives of the minister of munitions.

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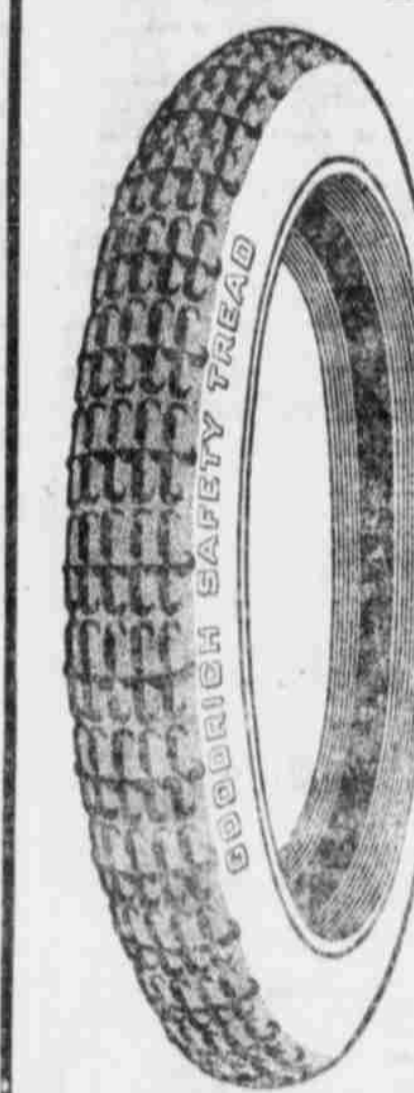
