DANIELS TO SPEAK IN MICHIGAN AND ILLINOIS

CHICAGO, Sept. 21.—A revised speaking schedule for Vice-President Marshall was announced at democratic headquarters today to include the following dates:

Iowa, October 6 and 7. Nebraska October 8th and 10th.

Secretary of the Navy Daniels will open his speaking campaign at Detroit September 25 and remain in Michigan until September 26, after which he will come to Illinois.

The schedule of former United States Senator Charles A. Towne of Minnesota includes the following dates:

Iowa, October 7; South Dakota October 9; Montana October 12 and 13; Idaho, Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada and Utah between October 14 and 25; Colorado October 26.

Former Governor John Lind of Minnesota will speak in Iowa for a week beginning October 11.

QUITS WOMAN'S PARTY TO AID PRESIDENT

NEW YORK, Sept. 21.—Mrs. John Dewey, wife of Professor John Dewey of Columbia college, has resigned from the New York board of the Congressional Union for Woman Suffrage in order to join the Woodrow Wilson Independent League.

In writing to the league, she makes the statement that she resigns from the union and joins the league more for the sake of woman suffrage than for any other cause. This is in line with the position overwhelmingly taken by the National Woman's Suffrage association at its recent meeting at Atlantic City, that the tactics of the Congressional union are threatening to put back the progress of woman-suffrage in this country.

that city. After Villa's columns had secured possession of the penitentiary the governor's palace and federal buildings, Villa himself went to the governor's palace, into the main balcony, displayed his force and made a short speech which in substance was as follows:

Speech to Prisoners.

"Viva Mexico! You do not have your liberty, I will give you your liberty, for I am your brother. I am going to return in a few days."

"It appears that there had been a banquet attended by most of Trevino's officers, and that about 2 o'clock this banquet was finished and most of the officers of the Carranza garrison were asleep. As soon as Trevino heard of the trouble he started toward the governor's palace, but his personal escort deserted him and went over to Villa.

"The party that attacked the federal building made into the building on horseback, and the guard there deserted to them. It is reported that many of the Carranza troops who were killed were killed by other Carranza troops, probably as a result of artillery firing from Santa Rosa Hill."
