MORGAN ARRANGES NEW BRITISH LOAN

NEW YORK, Sept. 30.—J. P. Morgan, financial agent of the British government in the United States, has engaged passage on the American line steamship New York, sailing today. It was reported that Mr. Morgan is going to London to arrange for floating another British loan of \$250,000,000 to be backed by American securities. Henry P. Davison, one of Mr. Morgan's partners, left for England several weeks ago. Bankers questioned about the opportunity for floating another British loan said that never in the history of the country has there been such a demand for bonds.

DERANGED WOMAN KILLS MOTHER AND SELF

PORTLAND, Sept. 30.—As she lay in bed with her sleeping mother, Mrs. Ella Graven pressed a revolver against the elder woman's breast and killed her and then turning the weapon against herself, committed suicide. This was the conclusion of the police and coroner who went to the scene today in response to a telephone call from R. L. Graves, husband of Mrs. Mrs. Graven.

It is believed that Mrs. Graven was temporarily deranged as the result of troubles with her husband, from whom she was separated. Before entering her mother's bed, Mrs. Graven left this note on a bureau:

"Rather this than the asylum. Use insurance for expenses."

VILLA 200 MILES FROM PERSHING

FIELD HEADQUARTERS AMERICAN PUNITIVE EXPEDITION IN MEXICO, Sept. 30.—Francisco Villa, with 200 men, is at Cusihuiriachic, a mining town west of Chihuahua City, according to reports received at field headquarters tonight. The last report to headquarters placed the bandit leader at Santa Clara ranch, thirty miles east of Namiquipa. If Villa has moved to Cusihuiriachic it would place him 200 miles from the nearest American troops.

Reports concerning the outlaw's movements, however, are being studied and checked in every possible way, for fear they are inspired and that Villa, instead of moving south, is moving north, as he is reported to have threatened.

One theory to account for moving to Cusihuiriachic is that he hopes to secure supplies there. He was reported in recent advices as needing clothing and forage.

No movements of Carranza troops toward the Cusihuiriachic region are known at headquarters.
