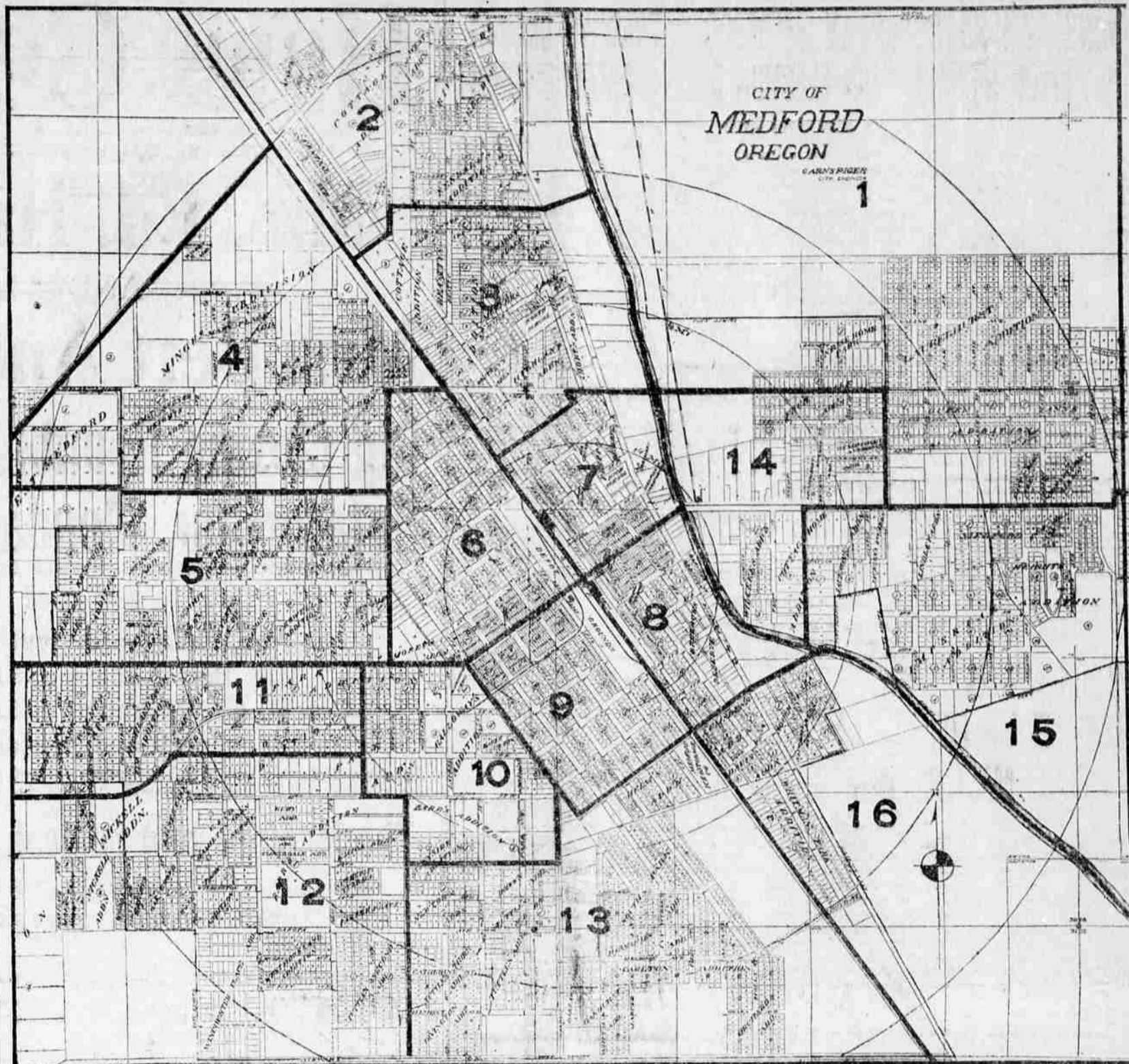


INSIDE FACTS ABOUT BETTING IN NEW YORK
