BUMPS CLOSE DOWN MINES AT FERNIC

FERNIC, N. C., Nov. 9.—The mines here were thrown idle yesterday owing to a series of disturbances called "bumps" by the miners. Those commenced shortly before midnight and continued until 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

John Jankal was entombed and is now given up as dead and it is impossible to attempt rescue operations owing to the danger to the rescuers from radioactive fumes. The theory is advanced that the disturbances are of seismic origin and it is now reported that the shocks were felt at points several miles from here.
