DECLARES WAR FUTILE

Lorraine are doomed to failure and the republic may as well reconcile herself to peaceful and friendly relations with her eastern neighbors. He holds that Great Britain has made an abortive effort to crush Germany as a trade rival by appeal to arms, but that there is nothing essential in the character of the three nations to prevent their union as friends. In respect to Russia, however, on the other hand, Count Apponyi declared that the organization of the country contains the germs of war and that she is compelled by the very essence of her being to attempt to extend her domination at every opportunity over the nations with which she is in contact.

Generation of Peace. "Once this war is finished," he said, "Europe will probably have at least twenty-five or thirty years of peace, until the generation which has passed through this conflict has departed."

Count Apponyi says that his views are shared by all leading Hungarians and with the possible exception of certain Slavonic elements in Austria, are also held by the leaders in that country.

DEPORTATION OF BELGIANS WILL BE DISCUSSED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—Announcement last night of the state department's action in instructing American Charge Grew at Berlin to communicate with the German foreign office on the subject of deportation of Belgians, brought out a flood of inquiries today for details and explanation of the department's action.

Secretary Lansing repeated the department's action as it was set out in last night's Associated Press dispatches and made this statement:

"The United States has not made an official protest to Germany, but has suggested to her what a bad effect on neutral opinion, particularly in the United States, such action might have. The instructions to Charge Grew to discuss the matter with Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg were sent at the suggestion of the Belgian government. The American action was not meant in any sense to be a criticism of the German government's policy. We do not know the full facts in the situation and cannot form a judgment until we have heard from them."

HAYES-TILDEN AFFAIR

is pointed out by officials of the department of justice, owing to the passage in 1887 of a federal statute to meet just such an emergency as that created by the Tilden-Hayes contest. This statute provides that congress must meet in joint session to canvass the returns on the second Wednesday in February. (The members of the electoral college meet in their respective states on the first Monday in January.) At this joint session of congress no other business can be considered, nor any adjournment taken except five adjournments of one day each; when, if the canvass of votes has not been completed, congress must remain in continuous session until the canvass is completed. At the joint session it is provided that tellers be appointed who open the returns alphabetically by states; that in case of duplicate returns from any state, if objection is made in writing by any member the joint session shall be temporarily dissolved and the house and senate meet separately and consider the duplicate returns. The statute then provides that in case there is a state law covering contests a decision has been reached under the state law, that decision shall be binding on congress. In case no decision as to the legality of one set or the other of electors has been reached under a state law, and one return is made by the chief executive of the state under the great seal of the state and the other is not, the return so certified under seal shall prevail. Each branch of congress in separate session shall consider objections to the returns, but shall consider each only for a period of two hours, with five minutes as the limit on any individual speech and no member permitted to speak twice. At the end of two hours vote must be taken. If the house disagrees as to what returns to accept, the matter, the matter shall be reported to the joint session and the returns from that state are rejected. If then no person has a majority of all the votes cast at the completion of the canvass, the house, meeting by itself, elects a president, voting by states.

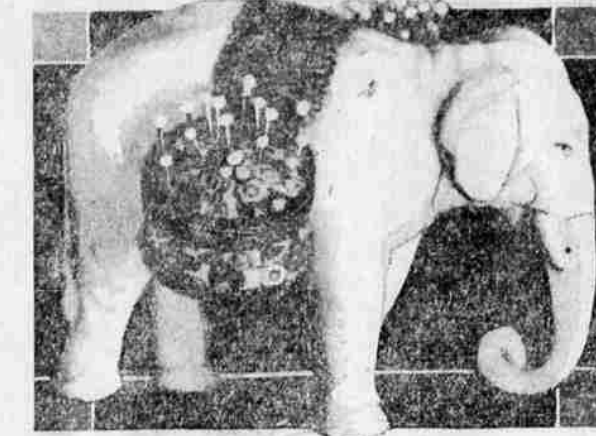

The court is asked to declare that the eight-hour law is unconstitutional and void.

BRITISH ARREST WOMAN WRITER

BERLIN, Nov. 15.—The arrest by the British authorities of Miss Emily Hobhouse, an English writer, is reported in a dispatch from The Hague to the Overseas News agency. Recently Miss Hobhouse was said by the news agency to have made a trip to Belgium, subsequently writing articles that there was less devastation in Belgium than in South Africa during the Boer war, and that in trips through many Belgian towns she had found the people were on the best of terms with the German soldiers.

VILLA TO JOIN ZAPATA IN SOUTH

EL PASO, Tex., Nov. 15.—Villa and his main force of bandits are going south to form a junction with the Zapata forces in the state of Morelos, he announced at Santa Rosalia, refugees who arrived here late last night from the south reported to government agents. Villa, at Santa Rosalia, declared he would leave a sufficiently large force in the north to harass the Carranza troops, according to the same source.

SUFFRAGE LEADER SUFFERS SET-BACK

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Nov. 15.—Mrs. Inez Milholland Boissevain, New York suffragist, suffered a marked setback during the night, it was announced today by Dudley Fulton, one of the physicians attending her, at a hospital here. At the morning examination she showed pleurisy had developed to complicate her severe anemia and her temperature was further depressed. Dr. Fulton said the next day or two would determine the outcome. Yesterday a fourth transfusion of blood was made into Mrs. Boissevain's veins and apparently she continued the improvement of the past several days.

RUSSIA ENFORCES REPRISAL AGAINST GERMAN PRISONERS

LONDON, Nov. 15.—A communication from the Russian war office, as forwarded by Reuter's Petrograd correspondent states that measures of reprisal are to be enforced against captured German officers. The communication says the German government transferred a large number of Russian officers to a special concentration camp and subjected them to particularly severe treatment owing to alleged ill treatment of German prisoners in Russia. The Russian government drew Germany's attention to what it characterized as the injustice of this measure, adding that if by November 14 this severe treatment was not done away with all German officers held prisoner in Russia would be subjected to a similar regime. No reply having been received, the Russian war minister has ordered that all German prisoners of war, who have been treated as officers, be placed in camps allotted to ordinary

BRITISH BOMBARD TURKS IN EGYPT

LONDON, Nov. 15.—British air planes have made another raid on the Turkish camp at Maghdaba in Egypt, according to an official statement issued by the British war office today. Four hundred pounds of explosives were dropped on the camp; the statement adds, causing considerable damage. The text reads: "Egypt: A further air attack on Maghdaba last night surprised the enemy. Our machines descending low dropped 400 pounds of explosives on the camp and stone houses, doing considerable damage. Our air planes returned safely."

BERLIN, Nov. 15.—(By wireless to Saville)—A German air plane on Monday night raided the air plane station at Saint Pol, near Dunkirk, Northern France, the Overseas News agency says. Several buildings are reported to have been struck by bombs. The air plane returned unharmed.

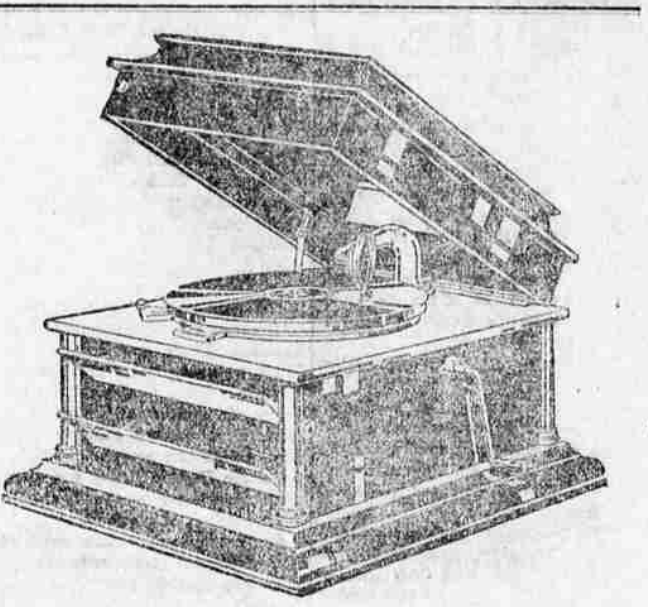

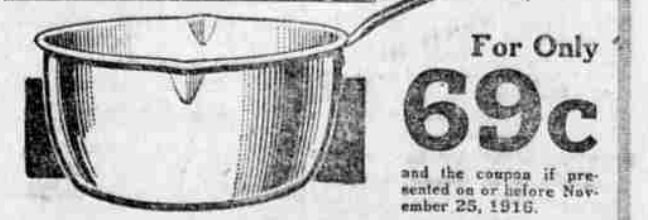
