

DEFEND LONG HAUL RATES TO PACIFIC COAST

CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—Defense of the low long haul freight rates to Pacific coast points without proportionate reduction of intermediate rates was offered by representatives of trans-continental railroads before the interstate commerce commission here this morning.

The case involves controversies between shippers of the east, west and intermountain territory and the railroads and steamship lines. Hearings will be held for a week in Chicago and dates have been announced for sessions in Salt Lake City, San Francisco, Spokane, Portland and Washington.

J. C. Campbell, of Spokane, is leading the fight for the intermountain interests to force the rates to levels which the railroads contend would turn all the trans-continental business over to steamship lines plying thru the Panama canal and break business relations between the middle west and the far west, running into millions of dollars. It was asserted that the railroads are willing to carry the goods in competition with water rates at rates something above the costs that they may keep the business and serve their middle west shippers.

TREICHLER PURCHASES BERNARD MOTOR CO.

Mr. Henry Kiene was taken into the company last March and will return to his former home at Du Boque, Iowa, to resume the banking business in which he was interested before coming west. Mr. Treichler has held the Overland agency in this country for the past year and leaves an enviable record amongst the people in this vicinity. The new management will endeavor to serve the public and carry out the same desire for honest and efficient service as established by its predecessors.

Branch offices will still be retained in Ashland, Grants Pass and Crescent City and the firm name of Bernard Motor Co., will still be retained.

MEXICANS GIVEN LAST CHANCE TO SETTLE PROBLEMS

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Nov. 21.—The American commissioners today gave to the Mexican commissioners what is understood to be the last opportunity for an amicable settlement of the problems that have arisen because of Carranza's failure to provide adequate protection for life and property along the international border.

In joint session Secretary of Interior Lane, acting as chairman of the American commission, informed Mr. Carranza's representatives that the American punitive expedition would be removed at a reasonable time and under conditions that would not impair the dignity of the American government or leave unprotected the territory just south of the border now patrolled by the Americans. Incident to such withdrawal he outlined the manner in which the American government was prepared to guard the long line of frontier and to run down and punish any marauding band that attempted a crossing into the United States. He made it clear to the Mexicans that this government would not tolerate any restrictions on the pursuit of bandits by American troops.
