ALLIES LAND AT PORT OF ATHENS

LONDON, Dec. 1.—A detachment of entente troops disembarked at Piraeus, the port of Athens, at 3 o'clock this morning, according to a wireless dispatch received this morning from Athens.

Dispatches yesterday said that entente troops were ready to land at Piraeus if resistance was made to seizure of arms, which the Greek government refused to surrender to Vice-Admiral DuFournet, commander of the allied squadron. Admiral DuFournet demanded that 64 mountain guns be delivered today, but granted further time for surrender of other guns and war material.

King Constantine guaranteed order would be maintained, but a serious clash was feared.

8 HOUR DAY FOR AUSTRALIAN MINERS

MELBOURNE, Australia, Dec. 1.—Under the agreement, which ended the coal miners' strike, the miners are assured an eight-hour day and the abolition of double shifts. The owners are compensated by an increase in selling prices. The federal authorities will remain in control of distribution until the coal output becomes normal.
